

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Merriwether Middle School is located in rural Edgefield County and serves approximately 380 sixth, seventh and eighth grade students from various economic and ethnic backgrounds. Merriwether Middle School prides itself on providing each student the academic skills needed to excel. We strive to offer a curriculum that maximizes the intellectual, emotional, social, and physical development of our emerging adolescents. We understand the unique needs and concerns of our young adolescents as well as the developmental challenges of this age group. Our curriculum is designed to assist our middle school students through the transitional period between elementary school and high school. Every student attends five academic classes and two exploratory classes. Exploratory classes include band, chorus, keyboarding, Spanish, computer assisted instruction, physical education and art.

Students have an opportunity to take high school credit courses. English 1, Algebra 1, Band 1, Physical Education, Spanish and Keyboarding/Computer Applications are offered to eighth grade students for high school credit. High school credit in Keyboarding/ Computer Applications and Physical Education is also offered to qualifying seventh grade students. In addition, a new academic support program was established for reading intervention.

The collaboration between our community, teachers, students, and administration has proven to be an excellent recipe for success. 7 eighth grade students were recognized as S.C. Junior Scholars. The Merriwether Middle School Honor Band received a superior rating in the SCBDA-Concert Festival and a Superior rating in the Carowinds Music Festival. In addition, four students qualified for SCBDA region band. Of our students enrolled in Algebra 1 classes, 100% passed the end-of-course Algebra 1 exam and 100% of students enrolled in English 1 classes passed the end-of-course English 1 exam. Twenty-five students were qualified to participate in the Duke TIP Program. We expanded our gifted and talented program called GATEway into all three grades this year. Our GATEway program targets gifted and talented students, as well as those qualifying for advanced classes. The purpose of the GATEway program is to promote academic achievement through increased rigor and innovative instructional strategies. Approximately 70 students participated in GATEway this year.

MMS has also collaborated with Santee Cooperative and Aiken Electric to become a Green Solar Power School. Our six grade students had the opportunity to be exposed the solar power curriculum and build solar power cars. A solar panel was installed on the campus of MMS which produces 1.5-2kw of energy. A dedication ceremony was held and students raced their solar cars for the media.

Merriwether Middle School is a member of a competitive athletic conference with teams in basketball, volleyball, football and added soccer this year. Edgefield County School District has made it a priority to focus on technology and make it available to students by upgrading the school’s WIFI, classroom computer labs and adding a mobile Google Chrome Lab. Our teachers and students have access to two mobile Chrome book labs. The school plans to continue upgrading technology and offering new technological learning opportunities to the students. MMS uses staff email accounts, the PowerSchool online grade-book, and district/school web pages for communication with parents.

The faculty, staff, and administration at Merriwether Middle School are committed to providing the best educational experience for all of our students. Our commitment to increasing student achievement and the overall development of our students to become productive lifelong learners will be made possible by a collaborative effort of all stakeholders.
