

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This has been another exciting and successful year at Johnsonville Middle School. All the credit goes to our students, faculty, staff, parents, and stakeholders who have established and attained impressive goals with tremendous enthusiasm and hard work. Our students’ creativity and academic excellence have resulted in awards and recognition at various events throughout the year.

JMS had three eighth grade students qualify as Junior Scholars. JMS participated in the State Jr. Beta Club Convention. They won first place in group talent, second place in Black and White Photography, and third place in Speech. Our academic challenge team completed another successful season. JMS had successful seasons in football and boys and girls basketball. Our cheerleaders showed great school spirit and supported our teams well. Many of our students participated in spring sports at Johnsonville High School. Ms. Debbie Tanner was selected as JMS Teacher of the Year.

JMS demonstrated excellent citizenship through various service projects sponsored by the Student Council and the Jr. Beta Club. The Student Council collected non-perishable food items which were donated to Caring and Sharing. They also held a drive to collect items to donate to a local animal shelter. The Jr. Beta Club held bake sales to assist families in need at Christmas. They also sponsored a Cancer Awareness Day in which students and staff wore the color of the type of cancer that has affected his/her family. The Jr. Betas sponsored dances for the students’ enjoyment. Ms. Rhonda Daniel’s fifth grade social studies class decorated bio-bottles where students decorated two liter bottles in the likeness of a famous person and did a presentation to the class on their research. Other events hosted by JMS included a Grandparents’ Day luncheon, Parents’ Day luncheon, Sons of Confederate Veterans Civil War presentation, Veterans’ Day breakfast, and served as a site for recreation league volleyball and basketball games.

JMS used a variety of available technology, including MAP testing, SMART boards, Mimeos, a CCC Lab, a STAR Lab, Content Click, the JMS Website, a school newspaper, and teacher websites.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
