

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Meadow Glen Middle School successfully completed its second year of teaching, learning and building relationships. Our faculty, which includes 41 teachers with advanced degrees, 12 National Board Certified Teachers and the Lexington One District Teacher of the Year, embraced an enrollment of 932 students and maintained high learning standards through reflective practices, team planning, technological advancement and weekly professional development. In the interest of shared learning, we also initiated a partnership with the Darla Moore School of Business (University of South Carolina) and hosted a Showcase of Learning for Midlands-area middle schools.

As an Expeditionary Learning school, we continued to promote student learning, foster relationships and encourage local impact. While monthly Town Hall meetings highlighted student achievement and leadership, the introduction of weekly CREW meetings allowed for the celebration of diversity and a sense of community. Grade-level learning expeditions challenged students with real-world applications, intense research, and the development of professional products for authentic audiences.

We expanded opportunities for students to demonstrate excellence in academic, extracurricular and service endeavors. Achievements included 15 Duke TIP scholars, a 98 average on the Algebra 1 End-of-Course test and more than 70 Jr. Beta Club inductees. Through the addition of the Outdoor Education course, more than 400 students received First Aid/AED/CPR certification. Students also received high honors for their participation in a variety of academic competitions including the Geography Bee, History Bee, Science Olympiad, MATHCOUNTS and Robotics. Our first-ever Mock Trial team was recognized as Region Champions. Chorus, band and orchestra received ratings of Superior, and our Musical Theater department featured 200 seventh- and eighth-grade students in the production of "Thoroughly Modern Millie." MGM athletics included football, basketball, track, cheerleading and volleyball. In fact, the volleyball team maintained an undefeated regular season record. In addition, students participated in initiatives such as Gators Give Back, Military Mentors and Camp CHOMP. MGM also raised more than \$12,600 for Relay for Life.

As we strive to address the needs of our growing student population, we are poised to meet the challenges of personalizing learning for each student. We have continued our House concept and sixth/seventh-grade looping model to maintain strong relationships with students and sustain our family atmosphere. Our efforts to close achievement gaps remain a focus as we conduct goal-setting conferences with students and attend professional development institutes.

Our active PTO, SIC and community stakeholders further validate our efforts. The MGM PTO sponsored a number of events and provided unparalleled school resources. Our SIC provided a collective voice for partnership and progression. These combined efforts create an environment in which students learn and thrive.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target.
