

## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Our mission at Northside Middle School (NMS) is to “nurture and develop successful lifelong learners.” We remain committed to this mission and allow this mission to drive all our decisions. NMS considers itself and the community it serves to be a close-knit family working to provide our students the best educational opportunities possible.

We are indeed proud of the accomplished students and staff members. In 2013-2014, forty-three students were inducted into the National Junior Honor Society to give us a total of 80 members. Sixteen students were recognized as South Carolina Junior Scholars. Seventeen students were honored as Myrdis Walker Scholars. Five students were named as Duke Tip scholars. We remain committed to serving the diverse needs of our 560 students. We consistently prove that a school with excellent teachers who regularly use research-based instructional strategies coupled with great parental support can produce outstanding results. Our students’ excellent performance on the 2013 spring administration of PASS earned NMS the Palmetto Silver Award. Northside earned a grade of 87.1 on the Federal ESEA Accountability Rating System indicating our performance exceeds the state standards. Our students continue to excel on high school readiness assessments.

This year our students embarked on two new initiatives: Achieve 3000 and A Research Paper construction. Using technological resources, Achieve 3000 is an online reading and writing program that presents students with informational texts at their Lexile levels. Through this program, 95% of our students have seen increased Lexile levels and over 240 students have reached the level of College and Career readiness. We developed curriculum nights to highlight student accomplishments in the ELA, math, science, and social studies classrooms. In addition, all students at Northside have constructed an MLA research paper. Student interest-based research papers were written by each student during the first semester of school. Using our technological resources of Chromebooks, iPads, iPods, iMacs, and Dell PCs, students analyzed the reliability of sources and cited evidence on their topics.

We are proud to consider the whole child at Northside. We enjoy watching our students grow as artists, actors, authors, musicians, and scientists. Our students demonstrate a commitment to our community participating in food drives for Harvest Hope, Spruce Up day at Northside, Hoops for Heart for the American Heart Association, Jeans for Teens for homeless teenagers, and our staff contributes in the United Way campaign. We recognize our community’s veterans as our students invite a veteran to lunch. Our parents and community members volunteer in many programs at Northside to include mentoring opportunities, incentive programs, chaperoning Field Trips and school dances, and helping at Field day.

We, at Northside, attribute our accomplishments to the dedicated community of parents, staff, administration, and Lexington County School District Two leadership. We truly believe that “Nothing Motivates Like Success!”

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
