


SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Cyril B. Busbee Elementary/A.L. Corbett Middle Schools enjoy the commitment of faculty and staff, the curriculum that engages learners, and the character of a supporting community.

Our PURPOSE is to become a learning community with a safe environment that fosters engaged learners, involved parents, and dedicated teachers. Our DIRECTION is to establish a supportive environment and engage every student in educational experiences in preparation for his/her next grade level. Our Fundamental Values are Commitment, Curriculum, Community, and Character.

Our school is a K-8 rural school in a farming community with an 87% poverty rate. Despite the poverty level of 87%, Cyril B. Busbee Elementary/A .L. Corbett Middle Schools celebrated a 3rd Grade Class that exceeded the school's and district's averages in Reading and Math, and this same 3rd Grade class exceeded the national's average in Reading on 2013 PASS Performance. Moreover, 5th Grade increased 6% in ELA, while 4th Grade increased their scores by 10% in Math. Sixth and Seventh Grades also experienced gains in Social Studies. Our engaged learners include 8th graders that exceeded the district's 79% rate with 83% in English I's state testing for the End of Course Exam.

With instruction as a focus, academic, social, and physical developments are priorities. Programs and activities implemented to support academic, social, and physical successes include PARENT P.R.I.D.E, Too Proud to Bully, Too Strong to Break Bullying Prevention Group, before/ after school tutoring, the Accommodations Lab, Synergy Lab, computer labs, the use of technology, Content-Credit Recovery Program, Reading and Math Enrichment, Extended Learning Time, Gifted and Talented, Student Intervention Team, School Improvement Council, Mentoring Program, Volunteer Program, Parent Teacher Organization, No Name Calling Week, Gang Awareness, Principal's Awards, Character of the Month, SRS Teach-Ins, Girls' Circle, Boys' Club, Junior Beta Club, Busbee/Corbett Career Day, Field Trips, Reading Incentives for students, Spirit Week, Honor Chorus, JUMP Club, Walk At School Day, intramurals sports, and team sports in basketball, football, volleyball, cheerleading, and golf.

Our school enjoys community support through grants from Savannah River Nuclear Solutions for Innovative Teaching Methods, Target Field Trip Grant, and Title I. Local businesses and churches have made numerous donations to support the learning environment of our school.

The faculty, staff, parents, and community members continuously focus on improving instruction that will prepare our students for the next grade level academically, socially, and physically. Our commitment, curriculum, character, and community foster a lion's spirit of engaged learners, involved parents, and dedicated teachers.
