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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Ridge Spring-Monetta Elementary/Middle School can be found in the small, agricultural community of Ridge Spring. Located in Saluda County, the school serves students from four counties: Aiken, Saluda, Edgefield, and Lexington. Our Pre-Kindergarten-8th grade school includes approximately 650 students with an 87% poverty index. Our faculty and staff consists of seventy-five teachers and staff members, three administrators, and two guidance counselors who work diligently to provide a safe, standards-driven, and student-focused environment.

Our Title I funds were used to decrease class size, provide early childhood literacy instruction, increase home/school communication and parent involvement, provide professional development for teachers, and to put a greater emphasis on literacy, math intervention, and technology. Classrooms are internet accessible with interactive whiteboards. We have two stationary computer labs and six mobile labs with wireless access. We also have iPods, iPads and document cameras that are utilized at all grade levels.

Community involvement activities included coordination of the Town Officials and School Community Meet and Greet Breakfast, Grandparent's Day Breakfast, "What's Cookin' on the Ridge" Cross-Content Learning Night, Breakfast for Moms and Dads, Terrific Kids and Teachers celebrations, awards ceremonies, and a Middle School Orientation Night. Our School Improvement Council involves parents, community members, and teachers in the planning, monitoring and evaluating of our school program to ensure continuous improvement. We are fortunate to have local churches and community members who provide school supplies, the back pack food ministry, and programs such as, Laces for Love, Angel Tree, and Good News Club. The Good News Club implements character development activities in an after-school program. A chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and a local Masonic Lodge visited our school and made a generous donation of supplies for our students and teachers. Our arts program represents our school annually with community- school performances at the Ridge Spring Harvest Festival and local events. Our school community raised \$3300 for the American Heart Association by participating in Jump Rope for Heart. Student Council members served at a Saturday "Right Choices Bright Futures" rally in the school district to promote good decision making and to communicate available community resources. Additionally, we received a Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Grant from the State Department of Education to provide a healthy snack during the school day to elementary students and to promote healthy eating choices.

Professionally, our teachers have continued to implement our district's reading initiative, newly written standards, and technology integration. We continue to analyze data to set goals to measure improvement in student achievement and to provide a rigorous and engaging curriculum. Our focus remains on professional learning in writing across the content areas, proactive classroom management, and application of best instructional practices as we continue to be committed to excellence.
