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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Macedonia Middle School continues to ensure the development of the unique potential of each student as a lifelong learner through a comprehensive and challenging educational program that embraces the best of traditional and innovative practices within a caring, supportive and safe community of learners. We are a high-performing middle school that integrates academic achievement with strong parental support, students' needs and interests, and community involvement. During the 2013-2014 school year we continued to advance our level of academic achievement and cultivate strong community relationships. As always, learning remains our top priority and was reflected in our PASS scores. Macedonia Middle was honored as a 2014 Palmetto Silver Award Winning School. On our State Annual School Report Card we received a rating of "GOOD" on both our Absolute Rating and our Growth Rating. Academic excellence will always be Macedonia Middle's focus.

Our tradition of excellence was reaffirmed through numerous awards and accolades again this year. MMS had students take at least one of four high school credit courses offered: English 1, French 1, Algebra 1, and Keyboarding. MMS is very proud of our 14 National Junior Scholars. In addition, the MMS band was awarded the Excellent Performance Award at the Concert Festival for State Band Directors. Our High Performance Business Education Partnership with Santee Cooper continued through the school year with employee volunteers as CHOICES presenters, Day of Caring, and career speakers. Our faculty and staff work in partnership with community members, parents, and businesses to provide students with opportunities to learn and succeed.

Maintaining and improving our excellent educational program will continue to be MMS's primary focus. We have continued to meet the needs of individual students through the expansion of numerous school initiatives. These initiatives include Read 100, STEMs, Accelerated Reading Program, The Gifted/Talented Program, The Assist Program and Compass Learning. Macedonia Middle School continues to participate in the Southern Regional Education Board's Making Middle Grades Work Initiative. Macedonia Middle School's teachers continue to grow professionally, with a large number of our teachers sharing innovative programs at a variety of workshops and conferences. Faculty and staff also participate in Professional Learning Communities affording them on-site professional development opportunities from their peers for the benefit of all students. Our PTO worked diligently to support teacher and department requests to ensure the success of our Student Award Programs. Macedonia Middle was awarded two grants this past year as well. The Arts and Basic Curriculum Grant and Wellness Achievement Grant. In September, News 2 named Macedonia Middle the "Cool School" of the month. Macedonia Middle School's school-wide emphasis for the 2014- 2015 school year will be to increase our understanding and awareness of the Common Core State Standards, strengthen our PLC's and continue with common assessments. Faculty and staff will be involved in extensive staff development as we continue our tradition of "Excellence in Education."
