


SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Westview Middle School, home of the Titans, is an exciting place to be. The students, faculty, and staff have worked collaboratively towards continuous improvement in all areas. Our motto for the 2013-14 school year, "A New ERA of Learning," was embraced throughout the school in all areas including our strong participation in Transform SC as a pilot school. Project Based Learning, a strong focus in many areas, grew even stronger allowing students choices as the standards were taught in new and exciting ways.

Westview continued to implement the Positive Behavioral Supports and Interventions (PBIS) process founded on the five pillars of success: Teamwork, Individual Responsibility, Tolerance for Others, Academic Success, and Never Ending Respect. This is a process and we will continue to promote these lifelong expectations.

Reflection and revision in all areas was important throughout the year. Academics are always the focus as we concentrate on teaching and learning. Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) met on a weekly basis to review and analyze data and make instructional decisions. Improvements were evident through the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) testing events comparing fall to spring data. Instructional engagement was further enhanced through the many improvements and support at Westview in the area of Technology. From the use of iPads to the use of student owned technology (Bring Your Own Technology-BYOT), the opportunities for all students to develop skills in collaboration, communication, achievement, and creativity were endless.

Working to ensure that all students were successful and engaged, our school offered many opportunities for involvement including athletics, clubs, competitive events, mentoring programs, and celebrations. Our PTO supported the work of the school throughout the year and assisted with student recognitions in many ways. Parents utilized the Parent Portal System and stayed connected with their child's attendance and academic work. Service Learning Projects continued to be a vehicle for giving back to the community through student led activities benefitting The United Way, March of Dimes, Relay for Life, and The Humane Society. We know that our work is continuous. We are proud of the students and staff of Westview and will always strive to do our best.
