


SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The School Improvement Council for Aynor Middle School has prepared this School Summary Report for you and the members of our community who are interested in our school. The report reviews the progress made on our strategic plan for increasing student learning, the test scores, and the goals accomplished during this school year. Aynor Middle School was awarded an "A" rating for their school report card.

This year we had: 10 eighth graders recognized as South Carolina Junior Scholars, 21 eighth graders recognized as Explore Scholars, Aynor Middle School Mock Trial Team competed in regional competition, the Aynor Middle School Robotics Team consisted of 12 team members that competed in county Technology Fair, 39 students were recognized for All County Chorus and performed with the chorus in January, 3 students participated in the SCMEA Solo/Ensemble Festival and all scored superior, 7 choral students auditioned for the CCU Summer Arts Program and received a full scholarship to attend, AMS Chorus hosted the SCMEA SSA Clinic where 457 girls from the lower SC region participated in the clinic. The Choral program, in conjunction with the Drama program, presented "Cinderella" where 54 students participated in the 6 performances of the Musical. One of the six programs was presented to our area 5th grade students. The 118 Sixth Grade chorus students participated with 370 other students in the lower state Sixth Grade Choral Clinic. In addition to the clinic experience, the 6th grade chorus performed with a superior rating by the adjudicator for their Italian Piece. Baby Blue Notes (36 member show choir) auditioned and was selected to perform in "Waves of the Future" showcasing talent in Horry County Schools at the Carolina Opry in April. The 7th and 8th Grade Chorus competed in the SC Middle School Festival and received an excellent rating in performance and sight singing. The Mixed Choir and Girls Choir also competed in the National All- Star Music Festival in Atlanta Georgia.

The Band and Chorus held a "Fall Music in the Parks" afternoon performance for the community in October. The Chorus also performed at the Aynor Harvest Hoedown as part of the Festival Entertainment.

5 students were recognized for All County Band, one student was recognized for All-Region Band, and one student for All-State Band, 3 students made All-County Orchestra, and 180 students participated in high school athletics, If you have any questions about the information in this report or want a copy of the school's strategic plan, please call me at anytime at 843-358-6000.
