


## SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2013-2014 School Year has been an exciting year for the faculty, staff, community and students of Ocean Bay Middle School. We are proud of the many achievements experienced at Ocean Bay Middle School in our eighth year. The community continues to provide support and continued assistance to our students and staff. It is with great pride and pleasure that we share the many accomplishments of Ocean Bay Middle with our parents, staff, community and students. OBMS celebrated and participated in many events, activities, competitions, accomplishments, and new opportunities throughout the year. Ocean Bay Middle is proud of being awarded, "Palmetto Gold for Achievement". This year we implemented "Blended Learning" and 1:1 Ipads for every student. This year OBM is proud of the 48 Junior Scholars, 91 Explore Scholars and 2 Duke Tip Scholars. Reading is strongly promoted throughout the year through: Daily Ray Time Reading, Non-fiction reads, Café at the Bay, Book Fairs, Book Club, Reading across America, 28 on "Superintendent's Reading Honor Roll" and a strong focus on reading across all areas. Forty members of our Science Club swam with the Manatees in Florida in adventure learning. Ocean Bay is proud of our ten plus club offerings for our students. Our Beta Club membership grew to 130 and received "National Beta School of Distinction Recognition". Mock Trial won 2nd place in the State of South Carolina and 2nd place in the "Battle of the Carolinas". This year OBM is honored to have three students competing at the Nationals for "National History Day". This year the number of Fine Arts All-County participants from Ocean Bay Middle was impressive with 7 All-County Orchestra, 17 All-county Chorus, and 14 All-County Band. The Black History Program was a tremendous success focusing on ethnicities, and better tolerance between different races and was presented by students. A Career Day was held with forty-three community participants in which students rotated to each career represented and 367 8th graders participated in job shadowing on "Ground Hog Day". The "Positive Referral", "Good News Card" and the "Staff and Student of the Month" programs continue to recognize and celebrate the achievements, kind acts and contributions of students and staff. Each quarter OBM recognizes Alpha and Alpha/Beta students and this year each quarter we recognized over 600 per quarter. Community service and Fund-raising for charities were focuses for OBM and we are proud to have supported: American Heart Association., March of Dimes, Special Olympics, Camp Pride, United Way, Food Banks, Breast Cancer, Angel Tree, Waccamaw Boys, Relay for Life, and staff and students needs. "Pro-team", a junior "Teacher Cadet Program" continues at OBM to promote leadership and an interest in the field of education. OBM students participated in track, cross-country, basketball, baseball, football, golf, tennis, volleyball, cheerleading wrestling and soccer at the middle school level and at both the Junior Varsity and Varsity level. Ocean Bay Middle School is dedicated to assisting each child to be successful in and out of the classroom. Our dedicated faculty, staff, parents and community work collaboratively to achieve the highest for each and every student.
