



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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The G. Frank Russell Career Center is a multidistrict center that serves Greenwood School Districts 50, 51 and 52. Our school received an excellent rating from the State of South Carolina and was recognized as a Palmetto Gold School in 2012 and 2013.

In the 2013-2014 school year, we had nineteen certified staff members that offer eighteen different programs and taught over two thousand students. We had one hundred and fifty nine program completers, fifty three Work Ethic Certificate Recipients and inducted forty four students into the National Technical Honor Society. At the State SkillsUSA competition we had three third place winners, one second place finisher and three first place winners that have an opportunity to compete this summer at the National Leadership and Skills Conference. We also participated in service projects with the March of Dimes, Relay for Life, Salvation Army, Meg's House, The Pathway House and the United Way.

We believe all students have the right to learn in a safe, comfortable and disciplined environment. We commit ourselves to student success and believe every student should have an opportunity to fulfill his or her potential. We are proud of our school, our community and we look forward to the future.
