continuing to offer opportunities for our students to apply education from the classroom to the professional arena as they participate in certification programs and work-based learning. Our mission is to engage students in Career and Technology Education, ensuring their success and life-long learning in the global economy. In 2014-15, 100% of our cosmetology students (12) and 100% of our Certified Nursing Assistant students (11) passed their state board exams. One of our students was named the Region Technology Champion and recognized at the 2015 Education and Business Summit. Sixty-five students were inducted in our local chapter of the National Technical Honor Society. Project Lead the Way (PLTW) program was recertified and was lauded for outstanding practices and our all-girls Robotics team placed 2nd in the state at the SkillsUSA competition. Our Information Technology students partnered with the Newberry County Coalition for Underage Drinking through their designs for the webpage and billboard campaign. We are proud to recognize 152 students who earned completer certificates. Newberry County Career Center instructors are fully certified and offer outstanding work based learning experiences to our students. All instructors participate in our district's professional development offerings, and groups regularly attend the SC Education and Business Summit. KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. This table below shows the number of certificates at what level earned by **Career and Technology Education (CATE) completers at this Career Center**. Note that these data are self-reported by the Career Center.

In order to receive the National Career Readiness Certificate, a measure that indicates a student has the foundational workplace skills to succeed, a student must take three subtests in WorkKeys: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information.

Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments. A designation can only be earned after a student has taken the three subtests required for the National Career Readiness Certificate. The table to the right show the level score requirements for each certificate level.

* Technical Skill Attainment - The percentage of students enrolled in career and technology courses at the center who earn a 2.0 or above on the final course grade.

* Graduation Rate - The percentage of 12th grade career and technology students who graduate in the spring.

* Placement Rate - The percentage of career and technology completers available for placement over a 3-year period who are actually placed in postsecondary instruction, military services, or employment. Note: these data are self-reported.
