

Florence School District Two is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing an environment that supports our primary purpose to educate our students for their post-secondary education endeavors as our number one priority. The South Carolina Annual School Report Card Summary is a comprehensive review of the previous school year's data from state-administered tests for HPEM and HPH. The district will provide test score information for the community to review upon request for their individual child or a schools' test scores. The State Department of Education posts district scores for review. The school system welcomes comments and questions from students, parents, and community members. Our local school administrators are constantly reviewing test data with faculty members in order to improve student achievement, improve professional development and inform community members of the school's test data. Florence Two is proud of Hannah-Pamplico Elementary/Middle's administrators and teachers participation in on-site and off-site professional development. FCS2's new reading coach works with the staff to strengthen literacy techniques across the curriculum. Teachers have embraced the Leader In Me program and have become the professional development leaders at the school. Teachers attend off-site offerings such as the Middle Level Association Conference, the Kindergarten Conference, The International Reading Conference, many best practice workshops, and both the state and national conferences for Gifted and Talented students. Many extracurricular opportunities support and enhance the core instructional program at HPEMS. The 2014-15 school year included the HPEMS Players presenting a production of The Wizard of Oz Jr. and the return of middle school athletics with football, basketball, and cheerleading. Writing and Social Studies programs were supported by participation in National History Day activities in Primary, Junior, and Junior Select divisions. Florence School District Two is proud of Hannah-Pamplico High School's two regional championships in boys' varsity football and basketball; as well as the opportunity to play for two lower state championships in boys' varsity basketball and baseball. It is an honor for Florence Two to recognize the students at the awards programs for their academic and athletic accomplishments. Six students scored 1100 or higher on the SAT; 5 students scored 24 or higher on the ACT; 3 students were Palmetto Fellows recipients; 20 of 69 seniors are eligible for the LIFE scholarship; 21 of 69 seniors are eligible for the HOPE scholarship; and 3 athletic scholarships. FCS2 students received a new record for the most scholarships in school history at over \$2,000,000. The District completed District-Wide AdvancEd Accreditation during spring 2015. The district will continue working on AdvancEd priorities during the next five year cycle. Our primary goal is to produce graduates who are competitive, well rounded, and prepared for the job market challenges they are seeking.

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


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




Districts with Students Like Ours are districts with poverty indices of no more than 5% above or below the index for the district.

The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.



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KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
