

The 2014-2015 school year was marked by outstanding performance and growth for the students and staff of Spartanburg School District Six. Dorman High School was recognized as a leader in preparing students to be college and career ready by the ACT College and Career Readiness Campaign, as well as being one of four high schools in the nation to receive the South Carolina College and Career Transition Award. Our high school students earned a total of 1,476 college credits during the 2014-2015 school year, including 998 dual enrollment credits and 478 AP credits. This year's graduating seniors earned over \$15,000,000 in academic, performing arts, and athletic scholarships. District Six earned an "Excellent" rating for the fourth consecutive year from the SC Education Oversight Committee. One of nine elementary schools was awarded The National Blue Ribbon Award for student achievement, four elementary and two middle schools were awarded with Palmetto Silver Awards. The Director of the R.D. Anderson Applied Technology Center was awarded the South Carolina's 2015 Career and Technology of Administrator of the Year. District Six was first in the state to establish a Project SEARCH program for high school students in special education. The transition program provides internship opportunities for students to gain valuable real-life work experience. All of the students from this year's cohort were offered full-time employment. Another example of how students in District Six are Always First. This year, student performances were held in the new Fine Arts Center. District Six is grateful to have this facility in place for our students. We are proud to offer a state of the art building for the many artistically gifted students in our district. In addition, the district received Region Championships in volleyball, wrestling, and lacrosse. Our students finished in the top ten in the state in the areas of competitive cheer, boys cross country, girls cross country, football, girls golf, girls swim, volleyball, girls basketball, wrestling, boys tennis, girls soccer, and boys golf. The District Six Athletic Program offers 23 different sports with over 1800 student athletes participating in them. Spartanburg School District Six continues a long tradition of meeting the educational needs of our students and community. Our Board of Trustees is committed to the continuous improvement and innovation of our school district for our students.

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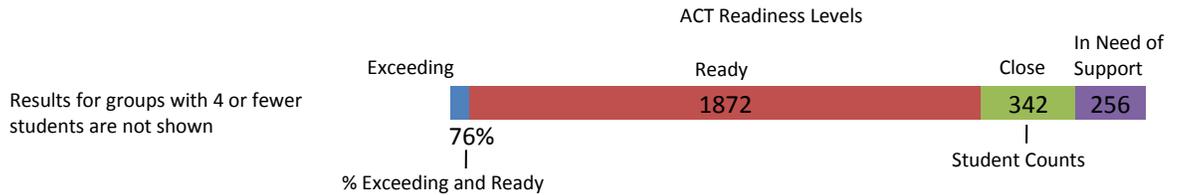


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

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


Districts with Students Like Ours are districts with poverty indices of no more than 5% above or below the index for the district.

The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

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
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KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
