

Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by empowering children to achieve their fullest potential through challenging and diverse educational opportunities in a safe, student-centered environment that prepares them to be lifelong learners and active, productive members of our community. Barnwell Elementary is a rural school serving 498 students in grades four through six. The faculty and staff are dedicated to improving student achievement and fostering positive relationships with the parents and community. Staff development is ongoing. Faculty and staff receive training in areas that will help them meet the needs of the students such as technology integration, developing and analyzing effective assessments, and writing across the curriculum. The dedicated faculty of Barnwell Elementary School have developed pacing guides which they use to assure all students receive the same instruction and are equally prepared to take the state assessments given in the spring. The grade level teams then use data from common assessments which they have developed, and subject related benchmark tests to drive the curriculum of the South Carolina College and Career Ready Standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics and South Carolina State Standards for Science and Social Studies. The students participated in many different events and field studies throughout the year. The fourth grade went to Edisto Beach, while the fifth grade went to Barrier Island, Ruth Patrick Science Center, and Charleston. They also participated in a Science Day. The sixth grade went to the Ruth Patrick Science Center and SREL, and the Audubon Society. They also participated in Career Day, a drama production, and a multi-cultural event. The Barnwell Talented and Gifted classes participated in numerous activities including a Robotic Competition in Columbia, SC and received exemplary on Project and Core Values. They also participated in the Future City Competition in Aiken, SC. Tag students were able to participate in the following field trips: Barnwell Courthouse, Dorchester State Park, Lexington Museum and Earth Shine, Charleston Pirate Tour, Barnwell County Airport, Medieval Dinner, Myrtle Beach, SC, Ebenezer. The Barnwell Elementary School Shooting Stars, a chorale group, was chosen to perform at the South Carolina School Board Convention this year. We are very proud of them. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






