
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

This encourages students to gain confidence and take ownership in their learning! Teachers and students collaboratively work developing activities/projects that enable students to ask the right questions, search for and evaluate researched information to both answer questions and communicate solutions that foster a students' natural curiosity. Coosa Elementary School Staff prides themselves' on being continuing learners. They constantly look for and share new teaching methods, technology training and applications, enabling them to work with students, ensuring that they are receiving the needed skills in order to meet the challenges they will face once they graduate from high school and the life choices made from there. Technology is definitely a learning enhancement by giving teachers/students information at their fingertips that in the past they would not have had access to. Students in grades 3-5 all have Apple iPad Airs for individual use. Grades K-2 will be able to use Apple I-Pads as e-readers. The school is also equipped with 2 classroom computer labs and 1 mobile lab, as well, for further technological use. In addition, our staff all has iPads and laptops where learning projects/activities can be shown to students as a group though each class having an interactive whiteboard and then teachers can help direct students, as they work on various projects and activities individually or in groups/teams, depending on the situation.

Coosa Elementary is a "Leader In Me School where our mission is "to grow great leaders who dream more, learn more, and achieve more and become more." This is based school Dr. Stephen Covey's book "The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People." The program encourages students making good choices through planning ahead, working well with others and taking care of their "whole" selves, mind, body and spirit. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






