Ladson Elementary provides services to students from 3-year-old Head Start through the fifth grade. Our district's continued focus on literacy provided our school with two First Grade Academy Master Reading Teachers who support the reading progress of eligible first graders. The program will continue to be extended to eligible students in Kindergarten, second, third, fourth and fifth grade in order to provide literacy support. Students will be guided to think critically and groomed to become personally responsible for their own learning.

Our school provides opportunities for our students to be involved in a variety of extracurricular activities. We have a gardening club, a recycling team, a Robotics Team, a school-wide chorus, a morning news team, Engaging Creative Minds activities and a Student Council. 

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






