Stiles Point Elementary helps all students develop world class skills as well as life and career characteristics identified in the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing rigorous instruction that promotes critical thinking and problem solving with a global perspective. Through quality professional development, our teachers deliver instruction using research-based best practices and data-driven decision making to help each child reach their maximum potential. Teachers utilize various assessments (MAP, AIMSWeb, Developmental Reading Assessment) to determine a student's specific ability level in Reading and Math. They then provide appropriate supports, interventions, and lesson structure to effectively benefit the student.

Our students are challenged to conduct themselves in a positive, productive manner by adhering to our Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) program-- Act Safely, Be Respectful, and Care of self, others and property. Coupons are given to classes for demonstrating these positive characteristics throughout the school allowing classes to earn monthly celebrations.

At Stiles Point Elementary, we serve our students with a whole child perspective. Our Health and Wellness committee recently held our first Wellness Fair, allowing students to hear from community vendors about making positive life choices regarding their health. Our PTA sponsors multiple sports teams and clubs (volley ball, tennis, basketball and archery) for our students. We honor and support our students as they strive to strengthen their minds and bodies.






KNOWLEDGE
