Recent professional development opportunities included: Introduction to iPads, Student Engagement and Ownership of Learning, Cape Romaine National Wildlife Refuge Retreat, CCSD Technology Cohort, Lucy Calkin's Writing Workshop, Discovery Education Science, Literacy Leadership, and Dimension U Training.



Several programs focus on developing the whole child. All students visited the Wet Lab with our coastal environment teacher weekly basis, to experience marine ecosystems first-hand through four touch tanks. We also began a student gardening program with the non-profit organization, Project Greenheart. Students helped plant, grow and taste a wide variety of vegetables and other plants. This program will expand to all grades during 2015-16. All students in grades K – 5 participated in our Spanish Language Exposure Program, a parent-funded program that exposed students to Spanish language and culture with instruction from a certified, native speaker. Finally, our guidance counselor and teachers continued to use the Positive Behavior Interventions and Support Program, RAYS, which recognizes students for being respectful, responsible, safe and doing their best.

At Sullivan's Island Elementary we believe that school, family and community must share the educational responsibility of our young people. Thank you for your support in helping develop our future graduates and world leaders!

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






