
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Northwest Elementary School students believe in the Power of Learning. Our school family includes a dedicated faculty and staff, students who strive to be lifelong learners and families who support excellence in education. Our school report card absolute rating was good and our growth rating was average. Northwest Elementary School received an overall rating of A-98.5 in the ESEA federal accountability system this year. Our school was designated as a Title I School of Performance. Our students continue to show growth in all academic areas. The percentage of students who scored met or exemplary on SC PASS were 77% in ELA, 81% in Math, 74% in Science and 81% in Social Studies. Science and technology will be an instructional focus this year. Our curriculum is research-based and our goal for instruction is student engagement with focused lessons. Northwest Elementary School is preparing students for success in the future workforce by enabling them to acquire world class skills and develop important life and career characteristics that are the qualifications to become a SC graduate. Our faculty participated in professional development this year which included data analysis, technology training, and rigorous instructional practices. Our goal this year is to decrease the student – teacher ratio in our primary grades and to continue with classroom interventions to improve instruction. Our professional development will target guided reading and project- based learning throughout the year. Our parents have attended parent - teacher conferences on a regular basis and they are very involved in the Responsiveness to Interventions (RtI) process. The parenting sessions at school were well attended this year and our goal is to recruit more parent volunteers and increase parental involvement in our PTO next year. Northwest Elementary students have participated in service learning opportunities in our community and our business partnerships have provided a variety of incentives for our students. We strive to provide every student with a quality education and we raise the bar each year to encourage all students to reach their full potential. We are proud of our students and wish to thank our faculty, parents and community for their support of all the students at Northwest Elementary School. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






