Yearly, we promote high ideals and high standards in all areas. We have worked at building 21st Century Learning Skills into our curriculum, learned about Common Core, and now are implementing our latest edition of state standards. We work to refine lesson plans, course presentations, use of technology, and individual assistance ...which must be an on-going effort. The formalization of the "Profile of the South Carolina Graduate" mirrors facets of aims and efforts in place here for years. We work with children to help them learn, and learn ways to learn... We practice and model problem-solving skills, critical thinking processes, real world character applications and social skills.

During 14-15, the Education Oversight Committee recognized the school as a Gold and Silver Award Winner again for results from state achievement tests. Students participated in WordMasters, Math and Spelling Masters, achieved Honor Roll status, and furthered their education and growth through many activities. We recognized and promoted good character skills, habits and attitudes. Music and art were still addressed in various ways, and these classes will be added back in 15-16. We received another "A" on our federal report card, and an "Excellent" rating on our state report card. In relation to others across the state, we typically fall close to the bottom in funding, but close to the top in relation to academic performance ratings. That, in itself, speaks volumes.

Last year, our district went through an outside evaluation review to renew our accreditation with SACS (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools) and their larger organization, AdvancED. Many workers and community members assisted in the preparation for, and completion of, this comprehensive process. We are looking at those findings – in addition to what we already know works - to sustain continuous improvement in our practices and our processes.

Our mission follows our mission statement... "to develop and nurture responsible individuals who are prepared to excel in an ever changing world." It is our hope and aim that every child who attends WGE will receive the best attention and best preparation he/she can in becoming his/her best example of a model "South Carolina Graduate."



The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






