

Our teachers use research-based, effective strategies in the classroom such as: Thinking Maps, Reading First, small group guided reading, Calendar Math, science kits, STEM, Math and Reading Intervention, and Reading Recovery. We are proud of our strong history of academic success. At Varnville Elementary, we also have various programs outside the academic world to focus on the development of the whole child. This year we continued to use the Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) program. This program rewards our students for displaying positive behaviors. We celebrate these behaviors quarterly. We also continued our partnership with professional ballerina, Karl Singletary, for our second grade dance program and a music curriculum including steel drums and recorders. Our guidance counselor taught character education lessons in weekly classroom guidance sessions. Finally, we provided free breakfast for all students. This program ensures all have a healthy breakfast and are ready to begin their day. 




