


In the 2014-2015 school year, West Lee Elementary School continued with the theme, "a small school with a BIG heart!" The school's mission is to provide engaging, quality instruction that encourages students to meet high academic standards and empowers them to be successful in an ever changing society. As a Title I school, located in Rembert, SC and a part of the Lee County School District, West Lee Elementary's commitment to the success of all students creates the foundation for the teaching and learning that occurs in our school. Teachers at West Lee Elementary School participated in professional development sessions that reflected these areas: Common Core Standards, Writing Effective Lesson Plans, Creating Individual Learning Plans, Data Analysis and Positive Action. These sessions allowed teachers to receive information on best practices and then implement the strategies in their everyday instruction. Data from the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards, Measurement of Academic Progress and classroom assessments were utilized to plan for and implement instructional programs. We are very proud of our achievements as a school community. This year at West Lee Elementary we also continued our ROAR punch card and celebrations, ABC Awards and our Quarterly Pinning Ceremonies. All students in grades K-5 participated in school-wide musical performances. West Lee Elementary hosted a school-wide Spelling Bee, participated in the district Spelling Bee with a first place runner-up and also competed in the Regional Spelling Bee. We had a second place winner of the district's holiday greeting card contest and second and third place winners of the Palmetto Pride Art contest. One of our students will attend the 4-H summer camp and the students winning design will appear on the camp T-shirt. The school participated in the Child and Adult Care Food program that provided free breakfast and lunch for all students. Students participated in the Farm to Preschool program. The students received a daily healthy snack of fruits and vegetables. This program enables students to gain insight about the importance of choosing a healthy lifestyle that begins with proper nutrition. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






