

Some of the accomplishments for our school were meeting AYP 10 of the past 12 years, having all staff highly qualified and certified in the appropriate areas, and a total of 6 teachers holding National Board Certification status on the faculty. We strive to offer our students many opportunities for learning and growth by providing programs such as Green Day celebrations to promote positive behavior, a computer lab featuring Odyssey and Study Island with a trained staff member available, an ESOL program, a gifted and talented program, the Boys and Girls Club of America after school program, and participation in community service programs such as Jump Rope for Heart, March of Dimes, and Relay for Life.

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






