
Our fundamental academic curriculum includes: A Bullying Curriculum, Reading, Language Arts, Mathematics, Inquiry based Science program, Social Studies, Health, Physical Education, Art, Spanish, Strings and Music program. Qualified students also receive services in our Comprehensive Remediation Program, our Enrichment After-School Program, Girls on the Run, and the following clubs: fishing, math, and art clubs. John P. Thomas Elementary School is equipped for 21st century learning with wireless internet capability throughout the school with updated increased bandwidth. Every classroom has a webcam and a Smartboard. We offer our students the opportunity of distance learning through video networking in all of our classrooms.

During the school year, John P. Thomas Elementary School has a variety of activities that are offered to our students and parents which add to the education process. Those that have taken place this past year are Back to School Night which gives an opportunity to all parents to meet our staff, Fall Festival, Spring Fling, Winter Concert, Book Fair, Science Fair, Grandparent's Day, Muffins with Mom, Donuts with Dad, and Field Day. Each month, students are awarded Character Trait Awards by their teacher for making good decisions and demonstrating positive character traits. In addition to our character education program, John P. Thomas Elementary School utilizes elements of Positive Behavior Intervention Services with students and Bucket Filling elements for our staff. All of our students are challenged to increase their independent reading time by completing their weekly required reading time and logs are awarded monthly for accomplishing this goal. The aspiration of John P. Thomas Elementary is to "empower all students to achieve their potential and dreams." We are committed to the belief that all children are learners and will take personal pride in accomplishments. John P. Results for groups with 4 or fewer students are not shown




