We are constantly evolving in order to meet the needs of our students and welcome any changes that will support student success. Rafting Creek's highly qualified staff delivers engaging, rigorous curriculum utilizing best practices in ELA, math, science and social studies based on Common Core Standards and the SC State Standards. Our students are provided with daily equitable learning experiences that help them to think critically, master learning, and develop problem-solving, as well as, life skills that will enhance their college and career readiness. Some effective strategies that were used this year include: Next Steps Guided Reading, Study Island, STEM, Learn 360, ABCya, Brain Pop, Khan Academy, Tig Tag, Starfall, IXL and Science Days. Our students also participated in Rotation Days where they rotated through various learning stations that were science, math and literacy based. Other valuable resources that were utilized this year were a curriculum coach, math and reading coaches, lead science teacher and a literacy bridge teacher. Title One funds were used to enhance our resources by funding educational, enrichment opportunities for both students and staff; such as the After-school tutoring Program, Success Academy Program (Saturday School), professional conferences and STEM workshops. In addition, Rafting Creek implemented a plan to increase technology resources. Students will have more hand-held devices to explore, solve problems, collaborate and produce products demonstrating their understanding and readiness for a 21st century global society. Our Character Education program integrates good character traits throughout the school, as well as into the community. It is designed to motivate and empower our students to have integrity, strong work ethics, good interpersonal skills and to be self-motivated. Our music and art enrichment classes focus on nurturing our students' creativity and innovation. Parental and community involvement are a vital part of our school in preparing future graduates and world leaders. We will continue to partner with all stakeholders to strengthen our services and to achieve the mission of Rafting Creek Elementary School which is to provide a quality education for all students.



ACT Readiness Levels






