
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

As the only magnet high school in Berkeley County School District, the Middle College, a collaboration with Trident Technical College, has successfully completed its fifth year. Our student body increased from 102 students in year four to 106 students in year five. Eighteen of our seniors received Associate Degrees and five students received Pre-Nursing certifications from the college a full month prior to receiving their high school diplomas. Our students collectively attempted 677 dual credit college courses with a success rate of 95%. Our US History EOC scores are among the highest in the district. The Class of 2015 earned \$1,900,000.00 in scholarships, and had eight Palmetto Fellows, 13 honors diplomas, and a 100% graduation rate. Our students participated in the regional Quest academic competition, earning second place in Social Studies and third place overall in the high school competition. Student extra-curricular activities include Beta Club, National Honor Society, Student Advisory Council, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, various athletic teams, and various service learning/community service projects. Ninety percent of our junior class participated in job shadowing. Our academic intervention program was a tremendous success in supporting our students as they achieved a 99% pass rate in all high school classes. We are located on the Berkeley Campus of Trident Technical College and serve students from the district's seven comprehensive high schools. Our partnership blends high school and college course work to provide students with rigorous academic pathways, comprehensive guidance support and job shadowing, as well as multiple opportunities each week for academic tutoring and advisement. At Berkeley County Middle College High School, it continues to be our joy to help students begin their transitions into higher education and bright futures. 

Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing



ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
