



Academically this year (2014) we are proud to announce that we had one of the highest overall increases in ACT scores in the state of South Carolina. We have also been able to increase our SAT score average by 100 points to 932. Hannah Pamplico High School emphasizes academics to ensure the success of all of our students which was highlighted last year when the all-time record in our district was broken when our volume of scholarships reached over 1,115,000.00 dollars. This year's senior class (2015) was able to demolish the standing record and set it at an all-time high of over 2,000,000.00 dollars in scholarships. What a great year for academics. We are also very proud of our athletics. We have accomplished our first region title in football and basketball in 15 and 30 years respectively. We also had the chance to play for the Lower State Championship in Basketball and Baseball. We are looking forward to next year's season. It is an honor and a privilege to recognize a few of our academic accomplishments: 5 students scored 1200 or higher on the SAT; 3 students were Palmetto Fellows recipients; 20 of 69 seniors are eligible for the LIFE scholarship based on the CHE standards; 21 of 69 seniors are eligible for the HOPE scholarship based on the CHE standards; there are 32 additional scholarships (29 – Academic and 3 athletic) a total of 76 scholarships were awarded to the senior class. Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing



ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
