
### WORLD CLASS SKILLS & LIFE AND CAREER CHARACTERISTICS



During the 2014-2015 school year, strategies were implemented in all classrooms to prepare students for ACT Aspire along with college and the workforce. Our school is helping all students develop the World Class Skills and life career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by utilizing Problem Solving Mats in all Math classes to ensure World Class Skills as well as continued STEM in our after-school 21st Century Program to ensure World Class Knowledge. We also implemented a career readiness class for all 6th graders to address the Life and Career Characteristics. Other initiatives that contributed to our progress include: Departmental Parent Nights, SAT/ACT Preparation, Compass Learning, Virtual School, Common Assessments, After-school tutorials and Yearlong Data Analysis to drive instruction. The School Improvement Council and the PTSA continue to work together to increase parent and community involvement. The school strives to keep parents and the community informed through parent newsletters, articles in the local newspaper, weekly parent contacts, Powerschool Parent Portal and our Blackboard Connect parent call-out system. **Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing**




The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
