

Macedonia Middle School (MMS) continues to develop the potential of each student as a lifelong learner through a comprehensive and challenging educational program within a caring, supportive and safe community. We are a high-performing middle school that integrates academic achievement with strong parental support, students' needs, and community involvement. During the 2014-2015 school year we continued to advance our level of academic achievement and cultivate strong community relationships. Learning remains our top priority. MMS was honored as a 2014 Palmetto Silver Award Winning School. On our State Annual School Report Card we received a rating of "GOOD" for our Absolute Rating and an "Excellent" for our Growth Rating. Our tradition of excellence was reaffirmed through numerous awards and accolades. MMS had students take at least one of four high school credit courses offered: English 1, French 1, Algebra 1, and Keyboarding. We are very proud of our 8 National Junior Scholars. In addition, the MMS band was awarded the Superior Performance Award at the Concert Festival for State Band Directors. Our High Performance Business Education Partnership with Santee Cooper continued through the school year with employee volunteers, Day of Caring, and career speakers. Our faculty and staff work in partnership with community members, parents, and businesses to provide students with opportunities to learn and succeed. Maintaining and improving our excellent educational program will continue to be MMS's primary focus. We have continued to meet the needs of individual students through our school initiatives to include FOXFLEX, STEMS, The G/T Program, A+ Program and Compass Learning. MMS continues to participate in the Southern Regional Education Board's Making Middle Grades Work Initiative. Our teachers continue to grow professionally, with a large number of our teachers sharing innovative programs at a variety of workshops and conferences. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






