

### WORLD CLASS SKILLS & LIFE AND CAREER CHARACTERISTICS

Granard Middle school also provides career studies and studied with students from Croatia. These components encourage students to develop their skills and abilities to the maximum and rise as far as their talents will take them. Our Robotics team placed first in the county and competed at the state Robotics competition. The Granard Middle School 7th grade football team was undefeated and was conference champions. Our school continues to receive a Project Unify Grant which is an education-based project that uses sports and education programs to foster respect, dignity and advocacy for people with intellectual disabilities. Our students participated in Regional Band, as well as having successful seasons in football, volleyball, and basketball. Our School Report Card score was a "B". Students and staff participated in Writing Across the Curriculum. This was a tremendous success. Granard Middle School received the Exemplary Writing Award from the South Carolina Department of Education. We continued to stress technology implementation in the classrooms and held school-based training sessions. Additionally, our staff participated in a variety of meaningful professional development opportunities in order to improve classroom performance. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






