
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Bryson Middle School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing a safe, caring, and academically challenging learning environment. We provide such an environment through the implementation of our school vision: Inspiring Excellence. We demonstrate this vision by challenging our students with best practices to reach their full potential and by the continuous professional development of our teachers. Our teachers are always seeking to learn new and effective strategies to use in the classroom such as: Common Assessments, Google Classroom, STEM, differentiated learning strategies, utilizing technology devices, inclusive practices, gradual release of responsibility, science labs, and interdisciplinary units. We are proud of our academic history and strive to continually build upon our successes. We also are equally proud of our students' accomplishments in academic, fine arts, athletics, and Agricultural education. Eighteen students were recognized as Junior Scholars and 67 were selected as Duke TIP Candidates. Many of our students have participated in local, county and regional band, orchestral or choral events. Several of our student teams have achieved county, state, and regional championships, including the girls' basketball team, Future Farmers of America- Archery, Tool Identification and Creed Speakers. At Bryson Middle we also have various programs outside the academic world to focus on the development of the whole child. We have implemented an enrichment program that connects students and staff through engaging seminars. Our guidance counselors taught the 7 Habits of Effective Teens during classroom guidance lessons. Our students participated in multiple community service projects such as fundraising for non-profit organizations, book drives and volunteer services. Bryson Middle continued our partnership with the Backpack Blessings program to provide food over the weekend to our students. Our annual Career Day featured over 70 speakers representing all of the career clusters. We also had our first College Day with local colleges and universities coming to share their programs with our 8th grade students. At Bryson Middle we believe the school, family, and community must share the educational responsibility of our students. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






