Sandhills Primary School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the SC Graduate by providing a nurturing academic setting for young learners. Our purpose is to lay a foundation for students to be career, college and citizenship ready where diversity, risk taking and student interests are honored. Foundations, such as learning to read and applying math skills, are the basis for our children's work. Our teacher teams have aligned our math and language arts curriculum to the new S.C. curriculum standards. Teachers are preparing our students with world-class knowledge by providing quality instructional and collaborative opportunities. Life and career characteristics, such as perseverance and self-direction, are embedded in our classrooms and hands-on materials. We believe families are partners in our work and each month invite parents to work with us exploring Covey's Seven Habits of Highly Effective Families. In addition, students engage in monthly guidance sessions and daily opportunities to discover how to utilize these habits of mind to become effective citizens. Next year promises to be another exciting year for our children. Students will have the opportunity to participate in Project Launch, a curriculum designed to expose children to science, technology, engineering, and math skills that are aligned to the S.C. Curriculum Standards. Project Launch also embeds skills such as creativity, innovation, problem solving, and teamwork. Gardening will also be an important part of our science and math curriculum. Next year, each class will be outfitted with a flower and a vegetable garden paid for with money from grants. Students will learn skills such as observation, tracking, measurement, and more. Students also learn characteristics such as patience and caring for living things. We will also continue our family literacy sessions through our PALS program. Our student-driven leadership teams will recycle, greet families, publish news, and generate real-world projects for all students at SPS. As always, our staff are committed to professional development. We will continue to frame our learning around quality instruction and the developmental needs of students. Sandhills Primary is a place where we teach to the heart and mind, and the entire school community helps children grow in preparation for the future.
