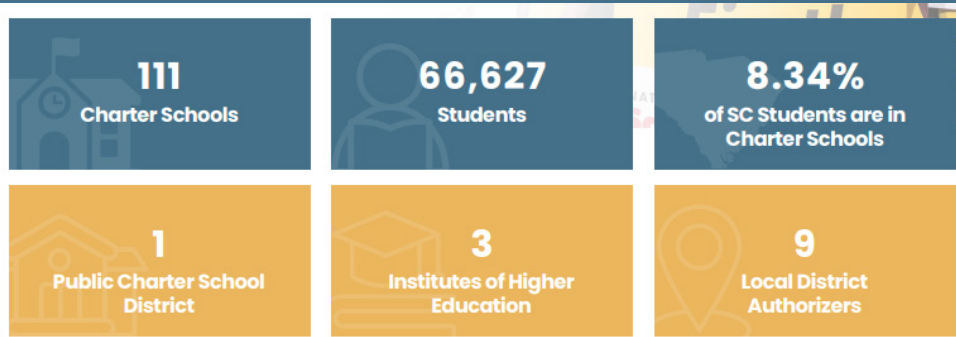

P&I Grant Info and Update!



The Planning and Implementation (P&I) Grant is part of the federal Charter Schools Program (CSP), which is designed to increase the number of high-quality charter schools. The P&I Grant is available to schools entering their planning year or opening this fall.

This year, three schools will be selected to receive grant awards through an external peer-review process. The current P&I grant, which began in 2020, is entering a no-cost extension period. Despite this extension status, qualifying schools will still have access to up to three additional years of grant funding, representing nearly \$1 million in total funds per school over that period.

At the same time, the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) is in the process of applying for a new P&I grant that would begin next year. Through this new application, SCDE anticipates increasing both the number of schools awarded funding each year and the amount of funding available to each school.

School Spotlight: Riverview Charter School

Experiential learning has been a cornerstone of Riverview Charter School since it first received its charter in 2009. Beginning in their very first trimester, students engage in field studies that extend learning beyond the classroom.

Throughout each three-year cycle, students work with local conservation groups to explore sustainability and horticulture, visit historical landmarks to learn about community history, and participate in service projects that include feeding those in need, visiting the elderly, and engaging in the arts. Each cycle culminates in a 3-5 day Capstone trip, where students apply their learning through hands-on experiences. While overnight trips for 60-75 students require significant financial resources; the school's Business Development & Engagement team, board, parents, and broader community all collaborate to make these experiences possible. For example, the 16th Annual Beaufort Twilight Run, drew more than 1,200 participants and over 250 volunteers, directly supports student participation in Capstone trips. Riverview is committed to ensuring no student is excluded from Capstone trips due to financial constraints.

While the school has years of experience integrating these trips into its curriculum, it demonstrates that similar experiential learning programs can be developed at other schools as well.

The Palmetto Achievement Center for Excellence Academy (PACE) is finding that same success with their Sign Language program.

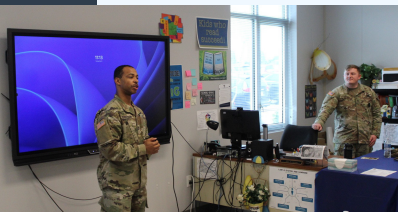




The Future Works: York Preparatory Academy

March 5, 2026 York Preparatory Academy hosted its 3rd Annual Futures in Focus Conference, an initiative designed to support juniors and seniors in planning for life after high school. The event exposed students to a broad range of college pathways, entry-ready careers, military opportunities, and practical life skills that promote college, career, and military readiness. Students participated in 38 breakout sessions across 21 unique topics, selecting sessions aligned with their interests and goals. Sessions included:

- *Price of Admission: Resources to Meet Your Goals*
- *How to Balance Your Personal Finances & Budget*
- *Becoming the Next Generation of First Responders*
- *Keys to Successfully Starting Your Own Business*
- *How A.I. Is Shaping & Transforming the I.T. Field*
- *How to Meet Your Goals in the Military*
- *Future Makers: Trades That Pay*



Beyond breakout sessions, students received professional headshots, engaged with local community-based nonprofit organizations, and took part in a catered "working lunch" with presenters. The experience concluded with a motivational challenge focused on cultivating a positive mindset.

The Futures in Focus Conference represents a scalable, replicable model that can be implemented in any charter high school to strengthen student awareness, engagement, and preparation for postsecondary success.

Charter School Transportation: Observation Phase



As the new year began, the SCDE Charter School Transportation Study entered its observation phase. Two schools—Willie Jeffries School of Excellence (WJSE) and Orangeburg High School for Health Professions (OHSHP)—were selected based on matching criteria to similar charter schools with transportation programs as well as proximity for onsite observation by the SCDE. WJSE operates a community hub-and-spoke model, while OHSHP uses a multi-campus shuttle model. While work is still ongoing, here are some preliminary findings:

- **Equity Impact**
Students from single-parent households and lower-income families with two working parents are disproportionately impacted when charter schools do not offer transportation.
- **Programmatic Benefits**
Transportation programs enable access to community facilities (e.g., gyms, theaters, technical colleges). This increases academic, elective, and extracurricular offerings at relatively low costs.
- **Cost Savings**
Schools renting buses for 20–30 days per year could instead own a used bus and employ a part-time driver for comparable costs.
- **Estimated Annual cost per bus** (prorated bus cost, repairs, gas, insurance, driver, admin expense):
Low: \$17,800 Median: \$38,150 High: \$60,000
- **Per-Student Cost**
Estimated transportation program cost of approximately \$315 per student per year (including non-riders).
