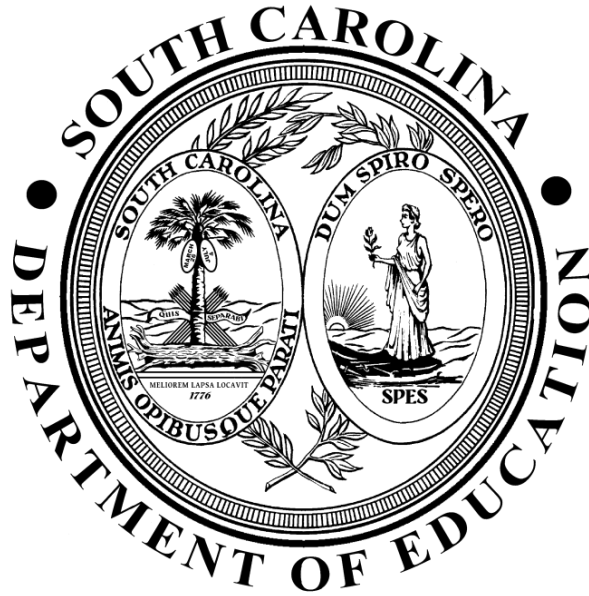

Guidelines and Requirements for Adding Certification Fields and Endorsements

South Carolina State Board of Education

Approved October 9, 2018, Updated September 10, 2019

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The Legislative Mandate

Statutory Authority: 1976 Code Sections 59-5-60(1), 59-25-110, 59-26-10 et seq., and 20 U.S.C. 6301 et seq.

State Board of Education Regulation 43-62. Areas of Certification.

I. INITIAL CERTIFICATION AREAS AND GRADE SPANS

In consultation with the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE), the State Board of Education (SBE) has the authority to establish initial certification areas or fields as well as certification grade spans, to revise or amend certification areas, and to abolish certification areas that no longer reflect professional practice or needs of South Carolina schools and students.

II. ADDING AREAS OF CERTIFICATION

In consultation with the SCDE, the SBE has the authority to establish certification areas that may be added to a valid educator certificate, to revise or amend these areas, and to abolish add-on certification areas that no longer reflect professional practice or needs of South Carolina schools and students. In order to add an additional area of certification to a valid South Carolina credential, an educator must complete the specific requirements for that area as outlined by the SBE's guidelines.

III. SPECIALIZED ENDORSEMENTS

In consultation with the SCDE, the SBE has the authority to establish specialized endorsements that may be added to a valid educator certificate, to revise or amend specialized endorsement areas, and to abolish specialized endorsement areas that no longer reflect professional practice or needs of South Carolina schools and students. In some instances, an endorsement may be required to teach specific courses. In other instances, the endorsement represents additional training and study to enhance an educator's professional practice. In order to add an endorsement to a valid South Carolina teaching credential, an educator must complete the specific requirements for that area as outlined by the SBE.

IV. SPECIALIZED ALTERNATIVE CERTIFICATION

In consultation with the SCDE, the SBE has the authority to establish alternative certification areas and routes that are based on specialized training and do not lead to an alternate route certificate, revise or amend these specialized areas, and abolish specialized alternative certification areas that no longer reflect professional practice or needs of South Carolina schools and students. In order to be issued an educator certificate in one of these areas, the applicant must complete the specific requirements for that area as outlined by the SBE.

General Information

This document establishes the guidelines and requirements for educators seeking to add classroom teaching certification fields and specialized endorsements to existing educator certificates and supports State Board of Education (SBE) Regulation 43-62 Requirements for Additional Areas of Certification. Except as noted in these guidelines, an educator who is certified only in a service field or a leadership and administrative field must complete an approved teacher preparation program in order to be eligible to add certification in a teaching field.

For the purpose of these guidelines a certification field is defined as content area or subject which may be issued on an educator credential and reflects an educator's content and/or professional preparation.

Educator certificates are issued for the following three categories:

- Teaching Fields,
- Service Fields, and
- Leadership and Administrative Fields.

Please note that in referring to grade spans, the following abbreviations are used throughout this document:

- Pre-Kindergarten: PK
- Kindergarten: K

Options for Educators to Add Certification Fields

Approved Program

An educator may add a classroom teaching field to a current, valid Initial or Professional teaching certificate by successful completion of a state-approved teacher preparation program in the new field. The program must lead to certification in the state that has jurisdiction over the program and be completed at an institution that meets at least one of the following requirements specified in Regulation 43-51, Certification Requirements.

1. An institution that is accredited for general collegiate purposes by one of the following regional accreditation associations:
 - New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Commission on Institutions of Higher Education
 - North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, The Higher Learning Commission
 - Middle States Commission on Higher Education
 - Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, Commission on Colleges
 - Western Association of Schools and Colleges, Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities

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- Northwest Commission of Colleges and Universities
- 2. A South Carolina institution that has programs approved for teacher education by the SBE.
- 3. An institution that has programs approved for teacher education by a national teacher education accrediting organization with which the SCDE has a partnership agreement or which the SCDE recognizes.

Coursework Requirements (Course-by-Course) and Exam

An educator may add a teaching field to a valid Initial or Professional certificate through successful completion of course-by-course requirements for the new teaching field as specified in these Guidelines.

Exam

An educator may add designated certification fields to a current, valid Professional certificate by presenting a qualifying score on the subject area assessment adopted for certification purposes in the area by the SBE.

Limitations and Exclusions for Adding by Exam

Adding a certification field by exam, as outlined in this document, is an option only for educators who have advanced to a current, valid Professional certificate issued by the SCDE.

A. Certificate Restrictions

Educators holding the following types of South Carolina educator certificates are not eligible to add a certification field by exam:

- Initial certificate,
- Alternative Route certificate (prior to advancing to a Professional certificate),
- International certificate,
- Limited Professional certificate, or
- Adjunct certificate.

B. Early Childhood Education and Elementary Education.

The following limitations apply to educators seeking to add these areas by method of exam.

1. The area of Early Childhood Education may be added by method of exam only if the educator holds a current, valid Professional certificate in Elementary Education.
2. The area of Elementary Education may be added by method of exam only if the educator holds a current, valid Professional certificate in Early Childhood Education.

C. Special Education

The following Special Education fields focus on services provided to students with sensory impairments and may not be added by method of exam.

- Special Education: Visual Impairments
- Special Education: Hearing Impairments

The following Special Education fields may be added by method of exam only if the educator holds a current, valid Professional certificate in another area of Special Education.

- Special Education: Early Childhood
- Special Education: Emotional Disabilities
- Special Education: Intellectual Disabilities
- Special Education: Learning Disabilities
- Special Education: Multi-categorical
- Special Education: Severe Disabilities

D. Speech-Language Therapist

An educator who has completed an advanced program and is certified only in the service field of Speech-Language Therapist is eligible to add the following classroom teaching fields by coursework or by exam as indicated. All other classroom teaching fields must be added by completion of an approved program.

- Special Education Fields (excluding Visual and Hearing Impairments)
- English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) (not available to add by exam)
- Literacy Teacher

E. World Language

American Sign Language may not be added by method of exam.

F. Service or Leadership and Administrative Fields

An educator seeking to add the following certification fields must complete an approved preparation program at the advanced level as outlined in Regulation 43-64 Initial Certification at the Advanced Level. An educator may not add these areas by method of exam or by completing individual courses.

- Library Media Specialist (PK – Grade 12)
- School Counselor – Elementary (PK – Grade 8)
- School Counselor – Secondary (Grades 6 – 12)
- School Psychologist I (PK – Grade 12)
- School Psychologist II (PK – Grade 12)

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- School Psychologist III (PK – Grade 12)
- Speech-Language Therapist (PK – Grade 12)
- Elementary Principal – Tier 1 (PK – Grade 8)
- Elementary Principal – Tier 2 (PK – Grade 8)
- Secondary Principal – Tier 1 (Grades 6 – 12)
- Secondary Principal – Tier 2 (Grades 6 – 12)
- Superintendent (PK – Grade 12)
- Vocational/Technology/Career Center Director (Grades 6 – 12)

G. ESOL and Literacy

The certification fields of ESOL, Literacy Coach, and Literacy Specialist require specialized preparation and may not be added by method of exam. ~~The field of Literacy Teacher may be added by method of exam.~~ (This option was eliminated by the SBE in October 2024.)

H. Other Exclusions

Certification fields for which a subject area assessment is not available or has not been adopted by the SBE may be added only by completion of an approved preparation program or coursework requirements as outlined in this document.

Eligible Certification Fields

The following subject area certification fields may be added to a valid Initial or Professional teaching certificate. NOTE: The option to add an area *by exam* is available to educators who hold a current, valid Professional certificate, and subject to limitations A-H above.

Requirements by Certification Field

Agriculture Education

- A. Requirements to add Agriculture Education by Coursework
1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
 2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
 3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for
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the area; and

4. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.

5. Required Courses

- Plant Sciences
(including Agronomy, Horticulture and/or Forestry) 15 semester hours
- Animal Sciences (including Dairy or Poultry) 6 semester hours
- Agricultural Engineering (Mechanization) 6 semester hours
- Agricultural Economics 6 semester hours
- Agricultural Science Electives 18 semester hours

B. Requirements to add a Specialized Field of Agriculture Education by Coursework

1. Bachelor’s degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area; and
4. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better
5. Required Courses

Certification will be granted in the specialized field of Agriculture Education for which the educator presents eighteen semester hours of coursework.

- Environmental Science and Natural Resources
- Forestry
- Horticulture

C. Requirements to add Agriculture by Exam

1. Bachelor’s degree or higher;
2. Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level; and
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area.

Art

A. Requirements to add Art by Coursework

1. Bachelor’s degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area; and
4. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.
5. Required Courses
 - Art History/Appreciation 6 semester hours
 - Basic Techniques of Design and Color 6 semester hours

- Drawing and Painting 6 semester hours
- School Art Program 3 semester hours
- Crafts 3 semester hours

B. Requirements to add Art by Exam

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level; and
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area

Business, Marketing and Computer Technology

A. Requirements to add Business, Marketing and Computer Technology by Coursework

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area; and
4. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of "C" or better.
5. Required Courses
 - Accounting 6 semester hours
 - Business Communications 3 semester hours
 - Business Law 3 semester hours
 - Computer Applications and Technology
Courses may include but are not limited to word processing, spreadsheets, database management and web publishing/multimedia. 9 semester hours
 - Economics 3 semester hours
 - Entrepreneurship 3 semester hours
 - Hospitality, Tourism, or Hotel/Motel Management 3 semester hours
 - International Business 3 semester hours
 - Management 3 semester hours
 - Marketing 3 semester hours
 - Instructional Methods for Business Education 3 semester hours

B. Requirements to add Business, Marketing and Computer Technology by Exam

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level; and
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area.

Computer Science

A. Requirements to add Computer Science by Coursework

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area; and
4. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.
5. Required Courses
 - Computing Systems 3 semester hours
 - Network and the Internet 3 semester hours
 - Data and Analysis 3 semester hours
 - Algorithms and Programming 3 semester hours
 - Impact of Computing 3 semester hours

B. Requirements to add Computer Science by Exam

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level; and
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area.

Dance

A. Requirements to add Dance by Coursework

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level; and
3. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.
4. Required Courses
 - Dance History/Appreciation 3 semester hours
 - Dance Composition/Improvisation or Choreography 3 semester hours
 - Creative Dance/Movement, Fundamentals of Movement, or Movement Analysis 3 semester hours
 - Teaching Methods in Dance or Dance Pedagogy 3 semester hours
 - Dance Production or Performance 3 semester hours
 - Dance Technique and Performance 6 semester hours

Coursework must include preparation in both categories below and at least three different forms of dance.

 - Concert/Theatrical Dance Forms: Ballet, Modern/Contemporary Dance, Jazz, Tap, Musical Theatre
 - Folk, Social, World Dance Forms: West African, Classical Indian Dance Forms, Folk Dance

- B. Requirements to add Dance by Exam
Not available for Dance.

Driver Education

Pre-requisite Driver Credentials to Add Driver Education

1. Valid driver's license issued by the state of South Carolina or another state in which the teacher is a legal resident.
2. Evidence of at least three years of successful driving experience.
The applicant must provide a copy of his or her driver's record from the applicable state agency which issues driver licenses. An applicant whose current driver's license has six or more points against it is not eligible to add-on certification in Driver Education.

Important Note: If a teacher holding certification in Driver Education has his or her driver's license revoked or suspended, the teacher must report this action to the SCDE at which time the educator's certification in Driver Education will be rescinded automatically.

A. Requirements to add Driver Education by Coursework

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK-12 level; and
3. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of "C" or better.
4. Required Courses
 - Basic Instructor's Course in Driver Education 3 semester hours
 - Advanced Instructor's Course in Driver Education 3 semester hours
 - Electives Selected from List Below: 6 semester hours
 - Simulation of Driver Education
 - Emergency Maneuvers
 - Multimedia Systems in Traffic Safety Education
 - Research Methods in Traffic Safety Education
 - General Safety
 - Drugs in Relation to Highway Safety
 - Motorcycle Safety Education
 - Administration of Traffic Safety Education

- B. Requirements to add Driver Education by Exam
Not available for Driver Education.

Early Childhood Education

A. Requirements to add Early Childhood Education by Coursework

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK-12 level;
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area; and

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4. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better

5. Required Courses

- The Behavior and Development of the Young Child
Credits earned in the area of child psychology are acceptable. 3 semester hours
- Curriculum for Early Childhood Education 3 semester hours
- Methods and Materials for Early Childhood 3 semester hours
- Practicum in Early Childhood Education 3 semester hours
The practicum requirement may be waived based on one year’s successful experience teaching in PK to third grade.
- Teaching Reading at the Elementary Level or Emergent Literacy 6 semester hours
- Content courses in each of the following subjects:
Mathematics, science, and social studies 9 semester hours

B. Requirements to add Early Childhood by Exam

1. Bachelor’s degree or higher;
2. Professional certificate in Elementary Education; and
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area.

Elementary Education

A. Requirements to add Elementary Education by Coursework

1. Bachelor’s degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Minimum qualifying score(s) on the content area examination(s) required by the SBE for the content area; and
4. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.
5. Required Courses
 - Teaching of Reading in the Elementary School 6 semester hours
 - Child Growth and Development 3 semester hours
 - Mathematics for the Elementary School Teacher 3 semester hours
 - Science for the Elementary School Teacher 3 semester hours
 - Social Studies for the Elementary School Teacher 3 semester hours
 - One of the following courses: 3 semester hours
 - Literature for Children
 - Art for the Elementary School Teacher
 - Music for the Elementary School Teacher
 - Health for the Elementary School Teacher

In order to add an endorsement, an educator must complete the specific requirements for that area as outlined in this document.

Pre-requisites to Add a Specialized Endorsement

To add any specialized endorsement to a teaching certificate, an educator must meet the following pre-requisites:

1. Bachelor's degree or higher*;
2. Initial, Professional, or Alternative Route certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK-12 Level*; and
3. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of "C" or better.

*Exclusions and limitations, if any, are noted within the requirements for the specific endorsement. Teachers holding a current, valid CTE certificate who do not have a bachelor's degree may add only the Read to Succeed Requirement.

Advanced Placement

Requirements for teachers of Advanced Placement (AP) courses are specified in R. 43-258.1 Advanced Placement. Each teacher of an AP course shall have completed the appropriate AP three-graduate-hour training program or have successfully completed thirty hours of training provided by College Board-endorsed professional development opportunities verified by the appropriate college or university.

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- Exception 1: Newly assigned teachers of AP courses will have one calendar year to meet the AP course training requirements.
- Exception 2: Teachers who hold a PhD. in their subject area may have the training waived upon approval by the SCDE.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Endorsement

The coursework and training related to this optional certification endorsement are intended to enhance an educator's skills and knowledge to prepare the individual to work with students whose primary language is not English.

Requirements to add the ESOL Endorsement by Coursework

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial, Professional, or Alternative Route certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of "C" or better.
4. Required Courses
 - Cultural and Linguistic Diversity for ESOL Educators 3 semester hours
This course must be designed to improve the educator's understanding of students with diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds. The course should focus on cultural and linguistic diversity and identity with emphasis on the following topics: culturally responsive learning environment, cultural bias, socio-economic diversity, and the home-school connection.
 - Principles and Strategies for Teaching ESOL to PK–12 Learners 3 semester hours
The course must include information on identifying ESOL students, preparing effective teachers of English language learners, using appropriate instructional and assessment strategies aligned with PK–12 English language proficiency standards, and understanding relevant laws and policies related to services and instruction provided to English language learners.
 - Practicum in ESOL*
**Fifteen (15) hours of practicum hours are required. The practicum hours must include experiences working directly with students whose primary language is not English and may be embedded in the coursework listed above.*

Waiver Provision

Coursework listed above may be waived and certification endorsement in ESOL granted for completion of a comprehensive, extended sequence of professional learning opportunities approved by the South Carolina Department of Education.

Gifted and Talented

Requirements for teachers of Gifted and Talented courses are specified in R. 43-220, Gifted and Talented. Each teacher of a state-funded gifted and talented course or class shall have completed a gifted and talented endorsement program approved by the SCDE. There are three levels of educator credentialing for gifted and talented: beginning endorsement, intermediate endorsement, and add-on certification.

- Exception 1: Newly assigned teachers will have one year to meet gifted and talented endorsement requirements.
- Exception 2: Teachers who have a master's degree or higher in gifted education from an accredited institution of higher learning may have this requirement waived upon approval of credentials by the SCDE.

Online Teaching

The coursework and training related to this optional certification endorsement are intended to enhance an educator's skills and knowledge beyond that required for traditional teaching and to prepare the individual to teach classes within an online environment. The online endorsement is only valid for educators to teach in specific content area(s) in which they are certified.

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All coursework listed will be offered online by the SCDE for graduate credit in conjunction with selected colleges or universities. Courses are listed by topics rather than specific names of courses to allow for flexibility and for current technology trends. Coursework by other providers may be submitted for review and approval by the SCDE.

Waiver Provision

Coursework listed above may be waived and certification endorsement in Online Teaching granted for teachers who have successfully taught three online courses through an accredited educational institution or professional development program, approved by the SCDE, within three years of application. Verification must be provided in a form prescribed by the SCDE.

Project-Based Learning

Coursework related to this optional endorsement prepares educators to implement project-based learning with students in classrooms and schools and to provide mentoring, support, and professional development to other educators seeking to implement this proven methodology with students in their classrooms.

Read to Succeed (R2S) Endorsements

Requirements for the R2S endorsements in Literacy were established in Title 59 Chapter 155 of the South Carolina Code of Laws (1976), the Read to Succeed Act. As specified in statute, an educator may earn these endorsements at the pre-service level through coursework or at the in-service level through coursework and/or professional development approved by the SCDE. Depending on an educator's certification area, he or she must earn either the R2S Literacy Teacher endorsement or the R2S Literacy Requirement. Educators who have earned a graduate degree in reading or literacy are exempt from the Read to Succeed coursework requirements and may request a review of their transcript(s) by the SCDE so that the appropriate endorsement(s) may be added to their certificates.

Any educator adding the certification field of Literacy Teacher will also be issued the R2S Literacy Teacher endorsement.

STEAM Education

This optional endorsement was approved by the SBE on November 14, 2017, and reflects additional training to support teachers in implementing integrated curriculum in science, technology, engineering, the arts, and mathematics (STEAM). The four courses required for the endorsement in STEAM Education have been developed to train teachers in effective ways to integrate content, teach productive collaboration skills, and use inquiry-based approaches to solve problems.

Secondary Transition Specialist

This optional endorsement was approved by the legislature in Regulation 43-62, effective June 26, 2015, and prepares educators to serve as postsecondary transition specialists who plan for students to move from school to adult life. A postsecondary transition specialist focuses on preparing students for all post-school outcomes (e.g., college attendance, employment,

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independent living). These educators will design programs for all students, with an emphasis on students with disabilities and students at-risk for dropping out of school.

Requirements to add Secondary Transition Specialist Endorsement by Coursework

2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.

 - Secondary Transition Assessment, Planning, and Program Development 3 semester hours

 - Promoting Student Outcomes through Collaboration 3 semester hours
 - Practicum in Secondary Transition 3 semester hours

Practicum may be waived with documentation of two years of successful experience in secondary transition programming and services or with documentation of practicum experiences embedded in coursework.

Teacher Leader

This optional endorsement was approved by the legislature in Regulation 43-62, effective June 26, 2015. The related coursework and training prepares educators to serve in leadership roles in schools while remaining classroom teachers.

Requirements to add Teacher Leader Endorsement by Coursework

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial or Professional certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.
4. Required Courses
 - Professional Leadership and Mentoring 3 semester hours
 - Curriculum and Instruction 3 semester hours
 - Assessment and Data Analysis 3 semester hours
 - Practicum in Teacher Leadership 3 semester hours

Practicum hours (36) are required. These may be embedded in one course or divided among two or three courses.

Waiver Provision

Coursework listed above may be waived and certification endorsement in Teacher Leader granted for completion of a comprehensive, extended sequence of professional learning opportunities approved by the SCDE.

Teaching Children of Poverty

This optional endorsement and add-on area of certification indicates enhanced skills of educators who work with children and youth who live in poverty.

Requirements to Add Endorsement in Teaching Children of Poverty

1. Bachelor's degree or higher;
2. Initial, Professional, or Alternative Route certificate at the early childhood, elementary, middle, secondary, or PK–12 level;
3. Completion of all required coursework with an equivalent of a grade of “C” or better.
4. Required Courses
 - Living in Poverty 3 semester hours
 - Any one of the following courses: 3 semester hours
 - Language, Literacy, and Poverty
 - Teaching and Assessing Children of Poverty
 - Home, Community, and Classroom Partnerships in High Poverty Areas
