Since the Extra Mile Club's (EMC) inception in 2008 we have believed that having one or more caring adults in a child's life increases the likelihood that they will flourish and become productive adults themselves. Furthermore, our staff and volunteers understands and research supports that establishing trust-based relationships with each and everyone of our youth results in them being more likely to be engaged at school and more motivated to succeed academically and socially. Additionally, programs like EMC provide important context where young people can build trustworthy, lasting relationships with adults and peers that positively impact their development as responsible adults. Our efforts have reduced juvenile delinquency and serious juvenile violence for the youth in EMC, especially when coordinated with broader community-wide efforts. We provide our youth with trained mentors and adult role models that are essential components of delinquency prevention. Evidence indicates that a combination of meaningful activities, positive role models, consistent moral standards, and viable educational opportunities has a prominent place in Beaufort County's crime control strategies.
