

REQUIREMENTS OF BARBER/MASTER HAIR CARE SCHOOLS
Chapter 17 Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation – State Board of Barber Examiners
(Statutory Authority: 1976 Code § 40-7-190)

ITEM/DESCRIPTION/MINIMUM QUANTITY

17-14. Barber Schools, Requirements of.

A. Qualified Instructor or Teacher

For every twenty (20) students enrolled or a fraction thereof 1 instructor-20 ratio

B. Barber Chairs Ten (10)

Mechanically workable, and the finish of same, including upholstering, shall be in good condition

C. Barber Chairs to Student Ratio

Have not more than two (2) enrolled students per barber chair 2 students -10 barber chairs ratio

D. Written Roster System

Have and maintain an up-to-date written roster system which shall be so used as to ensure that each enrolled student shall care for substantially equal numbers of patrons.

E. Complete Nine Months Course

The scientific fundamentals of barbering; haircutting; shaving; shampooing, and the application of creams and lotions; shedding and regrowth of hair, hygiene; sanitation and sterilization; anatomy; elementary chemistry; massaging and scalp treatments; scientific massaging and manipulation of the muscles in the scalp, neck and face; history of barbering and professional ethics; 1540 hour course

F. Bulletin and Curriculum

Containing full information as to the operation of school including physical equipment, number of barber chairs, work stands, floor space of practical and theory department, hours of operation, schedule of hours of each class, schedule of subjects taught and shall furnish the Board with a copy of same within ninety (90) days from the effective date hereof, thereafter within fifteen (15) days of issuance of any new or amendment bulletin;

G. Record of Each Student Including number of hours attending classes, practical and theory;

H. Student Permit prominently displayed behind his barber chair;

I. Ample and Sufficient Space

Between each and every barber chair as well as from work stand or wall to barber chair whereby the students will not be crowded or hampered. The space between each and every barber chair, measured from center to center, shall be a minimum of five feet, and the space from the barber chairs to the work stand or wall shall be; **a minimum of three and one half (3 1/2) feet**

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- J. No Barber Sign or Emblem Representing that it is a barber shop displayed in front of**
the place of business designating that it is a barber school or college and stating that all barber work is done by students only. **NO SCHOOL OR COLLEGE SHALL IN ANY WAY BE CONNECTED WITH A BARBER SHOP.**
- K. Ample and Sufficient Space**
For practical demonstrations. Each school shall be separate from any other place or type of business by a substantial wall of ceiling height; Separated by a wall of ceiling height- classroom and practical demonstration area;
- L. Room Separate and Apart from the Practical Room**
Must be separate and apart from any other type of business whatsoever by a ceiling height solid partition. Said room must be used exclusively for the training in theory of barbering and sufficient in size to accommodate students enrolled in such school and shall have ample blackboard space as well as charts on anatomy and other facilities adequate to teaching subjects required by law; Two separate rooms required
- M. Adequate Work Stand**
For each barber chair, same to be of such construction that it may be easily cleaned; and adequate tool cabinet for each barber chair, having a door as nearly airtight as possible and of such construction that it may be easily cleaned; and sufficient supply of solution in which to immerse barber instruments immediately accessible to each chair; and 1 for each barber chair
- N. Textbooks, supplies, equipment, fixtures, devices and tools**
Have and maintain textbooks, supplies, equipment, fixtures, devices and tools necessary for compliance with regulations. Per student allocation
- O. Commercial Washing Machine**
A **commercial washing machine** is a heavy-duty, industrial-grade appliance designed for high-capacity and continuous use in commercial settings such as laundromats, hotels, hospitals, classrooms and other businesses that require frequent and efficient laundry processing
- P. Commercial Dryer**
Commercial dryers are heavy duty, industrial grade appliance designed for high capacity and continuous use in commercial settings. The commercial dryers have large drying cylinder sizes, high airflow, and high BTU ratings, which help to reduce drying time and increase the efficiency of the laundry process.
