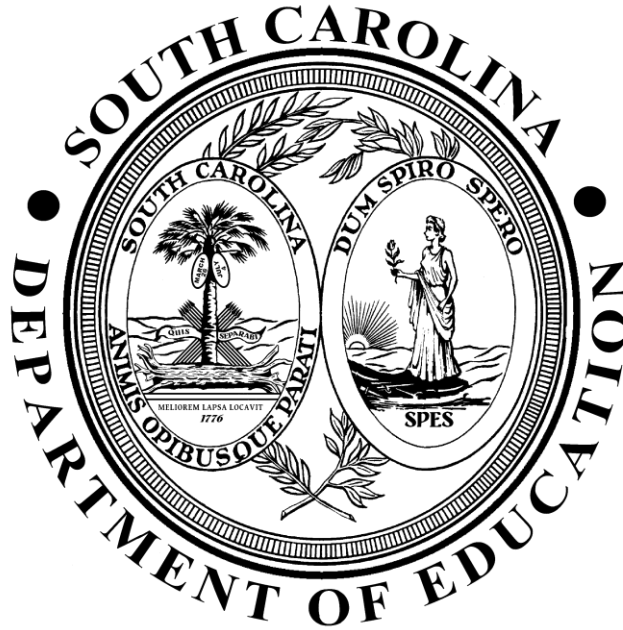

**South Carolina Seals of Distinction
2022-2023 Overview and Guidelines**

January 2023

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Diploma Pathways Legislation

On May 19, 2017, the South Carolina Governor signed legislation allowing for personalized pathways to a South Carolina high school diploma. South Carolina Code Ann., § 59-39-100, was amended to read as follows:

To support the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate, for students entering ninth grade beginning with the 2018-2019 School Year, the twenty-four units required are as prescribed in this section and in regulation by the State Board of Education. (1) Students will continue to be required to earn the units of credit as prescribed in regulation and, when applicable, be offered national industry certifications and credential. (2) Coursework must be aligned with a student's personalized diploma pathway. The State Board of Education shall promulgate regulations that outline the process and procedures for approval of courses to personalize pathways based on students' postsecondary plans and include an annually updated course activity coding manual listing approved courses. The individualized graduation planning process must plan each student's personalized pathway based on his postsecondary plans.

This personalized path to a high school diploma is referred to as Diploma Pathways. There are three key components of this legislation: Diploma Pathway Courses developed by a school district to meet the unique needs of students, Seals of Distinction, and the State Employability Credential.

The amendment above led to the following addition to Regulation No.: R.43-234 Defined Program, Grades 9-12 and Graduation Requirements:

B. Students shall have the opportunity to earn endorsements within each high school diploma pathway; however, earning an endorsement is not a requirement for graduation. Endorsements shall identify a particular area of focus, beginning with the freshman class of 2018–19. The earning of a graduation endorsement shall be based upon the following criteria:

1. Students shall meet all requirements for earning a South Carolina high school diploma as set forth above and within this regulation.
2. Students may earn one or more endorsements in pathways approved in guidelines set by the State Board of Education (SBE). School districts may apply to the SBE to have additional endorsements approved.
3. English I, II, III, IV or their course equivalents (customized English I, II, III, IV as approved by the SBE through the locally designed course process as mentioned in II.H.1) or higher level courses (Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, Dual Credit, etc.) must be taken to receive an endorsement.

C. The South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) has the authority to develop guidelines approved by the SBE in accordance with provisions of this regulation.

Seals of Distinction Overview

The South Carolina Seals of Distinction are a state-level award granted by the South Carolina Department of Education.

The Seals of Distinction do not appear on students' transcripts or diplomas but are instead issued via the Parchment application in the form of a South Carolina Department of Education digital credential. Students must possess a Parchment account to claim their South Carolina Department of Education Seal of Distinction digital credentials.

The Seals of Distinction digital credentials will be available for students to claim after graduation. An email announcing their availability will be sent to the email address stored in the 'Postgraduate Student Email' field in PowerSchool.

The implementation of this policy is required for all Local Education Agency high schools.

Seals of Distinction Qualifying Criteria Templates

The graduating class of 2023 may meet the requirements of the 2021-2022 **or** 2022-2023 Seals of Distinction Templates to qualify for any Seal of Distinction.

The graduating classes of 2024 and after may not use the criteria of the 2021-2022 Seals of Distinction Template to qualify for any Seal of Distinction.

The 4 Advanced Coursework credits of honors or higher can be earned by additional honors or higher courses taken in the subject areas listed above.

For example: A student takes English 1 Honors, English 2 Honors, English 3 Honors, and English 4 Honors. English 1 Honors and English 2 Honors qualifies as the 2 required English courses at honors level or higher. English 3 Honors and English 4 Honors can be counted as 2 of the 4 Advanced Coursework credits as they were taken during the two years prior to graduation.

The Diploma Pathways Seal of Distinction for World Language Specialization can be earned with accumulated World Language course credits OR with a minimum score on a nationally normed language assessment.

To reach the "Intermediate Low" threshold using a STAMP score, a minimum score of 4 in ALL areas (Reading, Writing, Listening, and Speaking) is required. A score of less than 4 in ANY of the areas (Reading, Writing, Listening, and Speaking), does not meet the minimum required score.

The Diploma Pathways Seals of Distinction for World Language differs from the South Carolina Seal of Biliteracy. The [South Carolina Seal of Biliteracy](#) is a proficiency-based award. It is awarded based on the levels of proficiency measured by a nationally normed language assessment. Students cannot use accumulated credits to qualify for the South Carolina Seal of Biliteracy.

- Individual recognition for performance in a monologue, one act, musical theater, or "Tech Olympics" event through the South Carolina Theater Association or Palmetto Dramatic Association.
- Accumulation of points sufficient for membership in the International Thespian Society.

Visual Art

- Promotion of artwork from regional SCAEA Youth Art Month Exhibits to state SCAEA Youth Art Month Exhibit.
- Individual recognition in externally juried local shows and exhibits.
- Induction into National Art Honor Society.

Timeline for Meeting Qualifying Criteria for the Seals of Distinction

The graduating class of 2023 may meet the criteria on the 2021-2022 **or** 2022-2023 Seals of Distinction Templates to qualify for any Seal of Distinction.

The graduating classes of 2024 and after may not use the criteria from the 2021-2022 Seals of Distinction Template to qualify for any Seal of Distinction.

The Seals of Distinction GPA requirements may be met by either the:

- End of first semester senior year GPA*
- Final GPA

*Seniors who meet the GPA criteria at the end of first semester have satisfied this requirement. These students do not have to requalify with their final GPA.

School districts should designate a cutoff date to report test scores, industry credentials, etc. that may be required to earn a Seal of Distinction.

Enrich Seals of Distinction Report

The Enrich Seals of Distinction Report was created to assist school/district staff identify students who qualify for one or more Seals of Distinction. This report should be used in conjunction with other verification methods as it does not identify all earned Seals of Distinction.

The Enrich Seals of Distinction report is being updated to identify the 2022-2023 Seals of Distinction requirements and should be released to Enrich production systems in mid-February with Enrich version 23.1.1.

The Enrich Seals of Distinction report is located on the Enrich home page for users who have the appropriate permission enabled. If the Seals of Distinction Report is not available in your Reports box, contact your Enrich system administrator to enable the permission for you.

To run the report, click on the Seals of Distinction report name. A Report Criteria box will appear where you can select a school if desired. The “Class of” filter will default to the current roster year. To view underclassmen reports, select later years.

- Click **Run** - to render the report on the screen (use the vertical and horizontal scroll bars to view all columns and rows.)
- Click **Export** - to save the results in a CSV file that you can open in Excel (this option allows you to filter and sort as desired.)

The **Help** link at the top right of the screen can be used to view a list of the Seals of Distinction criteria.

The report contains one row per student. There are 7 columns showing which Seal(s) of Distinction the student qualifies for. Scroll to the right to see more columns with supporting details, including assessments, credits, and career information.

- Applicable assessments (ACT, SAT, ASVAB, etc.) must be imported into Enrich in order for the report to be accurate.

 - World Language Specialization Seal – Enrich does not currently support the import of **ACTFL** or **ASL** assessments.

- A new assessment field “SC Arts Seal External Task” will be added to allow districts to manually record when a student meets an “externally evaluated performance task” requirement in Dance, Music, Theater or Visual Art. The Seals report will use this data to help determine if students have earned an Arts Specialization Seal.
- Enrich will support the ACTFL assessments such as AAPL, WPT, OPI and Alira. These scores can be imported or added manually. The Seals report will use the ACTFL test score data to determine if students have earned the World Language Specialization Seal. Contact Enrich Support for more information regarding the file import.

The Enrich report is a tool school/district staff may use to identify students who qualify for one or more Seals of Distinction. The official coding of earned Seals of Distinction must be completed in PowerSchool.

PowerSchool Coding for Seals of Distinction

Earned Seals of Distinction are coded on the SC Student Information page. Only earned and verified Seals of Distinction should be entered on this page.

The graduating class of 2023 may meet the requirements of the 2021-2022 **or** 2022-2023 Seals of Distinction Templates to qualify for any Seal of Distinction.

To enter a student’s earned Seal(s) of Distinction, navigate to the SC Student Information page:

Start Page > Student Selection > South Carolina State Information > SC Student Information

Scroll to the section titled "Diploma Pathways Seals of Distinction." Click the "New" button to designate all earned Seals of Distinction for the student. (If the student earned more than one Seal of Distinction, click the "New" button again to add additional earned Seal(s) of Distinction.)

Once all earned Seals of Distinction have been added, click the "Submit" button at the bottom of the page. Note that the entry/entries will not be saved until submitted in PowerSchool.

- The deadline to enter earned Seals of Distinction for first semester graduates is January 27, 2023.
- The deadline to enter earned Seals of Distinction for spring graduates is June 15, 2023.
- The deadline to enter earned Seals of Distinction for summer graduates is August 31, 2023.

Seals of Distinction Coding in IGPs

Seals of Distinction are not required but optional endorsements for students. Therefore, Seals of Distinction are not required to be entered into students' IGP Success Planner. However, by entering Seals of Distinction in the IGP Success Planner (on step 2), schools will have the ability to create reports to gather data for intended Seals of Distinction.

EEDA Majors **MUST** be entered in the IGP Success Planner by the end of students' sophomore year.

Any EEDA Major and/or Seal of Distinction designated in the IGP Planner is "intended," not "earned." All earned Seals of Distinction must be entered into students' SC Student Information page. (See PowerSchool Coding for Seals of Distinction above.)

Postgraduate Student Email Address

A valid email address, accessible to the student after exiting high school, is necessary for issuance of the student's Seal(s) of Distinction. This email address (one valid email address only, per student) must be entered in the "Postgraduate Student Email" field on the Demographics page in PowerSchool:

Start Page > Student Selection > General Demographics

Please do not enter school/district email addresses, as students may no longer have access to such email addresses after graduation.

Instructions for claiming earned Seals of Distinction will be emailed to the email address listed in the "Postgraduate Student Email" field a few weeks after graduation.

- The deadline to enter postgraduate student email addresses for first semester graduates is January 27, 2023
- The deadline to enter postgraduate student email addresses for spring graduates is June 15, 2023
- The deadline to enter postgraduate student email addresses for summer graduates is August 31, 2023

Parchment Accounts

The Seals of Distinction are awarded by the South Carolina Department of Education in the form of digital credentials issued via the Parchment application. Student recipients are notified via email that their Seal(s) of Distinction are ready to be claimed in Parchment. Students can then claim, share, and send their digital credential through Parchment's platform.

High schools are not required to have a Parchment account for their students to claim their Seals of Distinction through Parchment. Because the Seals of Distinction are issued on behalf of the

South Carolina Department of Education (rather than on behalf of the high school) through Parchment, it's not a requirement for the high school to have a Parchment account.

Graduates must possess a Parchment account to claim their Seal of Distinction digital credential(s.) Once the award is issued, graduates will receive an email from Parchment asking them to claim their Seal(s) of Distinction. This notification email will be sent a few weeks after graduation. If the graduate doesn't have a Parchment account, the email will prompt them to create an account with Parchment.

Students with established Parchment accounts:

The postgraduate student email address entered into PowerSchool MUST match the student's personal email address associated with their Parchment account. If initially linked to a district email address, the student's Parchment account must be updated with their personal email address before losing access to that district email address. This can be accomplished by the student after logging into their Parchment account.

Students without established Parchment accounts:

Students without established Parchment accounts must create an account to claim their Seal(s) of Distinction. This account can be created at any time, including after receipt of the notification email from Parchment.

District Responsibilities

Dissemination of Information

Schools and districts will provide all students and their families information on the South Carolina Seals of Distinction as soon as possible so that students can organize their schedules and plan to meet the requirements necessary to receive this honor.

Schools and districts will provide all students and their families information on creating Parchment accounts that must be used to claim their earned Seal(s) of Distinction digital credential(s.)

Record Keeping

Districts will designate a staff member (or multiple staff members) to serve as a liaison between the district and the Office of Research and Data Analysis (ORDA) at the South Carolina Department of Education. Districts will assign the designated person to the Seals of Distinction Contact role in the [District Entity Management System \(DEIM\)](#).

Schools and districts will develop procedures locally to ensure student Parchment accounts are available to students beyond graduation for accessing their digital Seals of Distinction.

Schools and districts will develop procedures locally to determine who at the school level will enter students' verified Seal(s) of Distinction and Postgraduate Email Address into PowerSchool.

- Deadline to enter earned Seals of Distinction and Postgraduate Student Email addresses for first semester graduates: January 27, 2023.

- Deadline to enter earned Seals of Distinction and Postgraduate Student Email addresses for spring graduates: June 15, 2023.
- Deadline to enter earned Seals of Distinction and Postgraduate Student Email addresses for summer graduates: August 31, 2023.

Recognition and Awarding

Schools and districts are encouraged to make the awarding of South Carolina's Seals of Distinction a prominent component at appropriate ceremonies such as graduation.

However, schools and districts may not offer a district level recognition of earned Seals of Distinction until the digital credential has been verified by school personnel.

Schools and districts will inform all graduates and their families their Seal(s) of Distinction will be available a few weeks after graduation. Notification of availability will be sent to the students' postgraduate student email addresses recorded in PowerSchool.
