RE: 2023–24 Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) Required Reporting

On May 18, 2018, Governor Henry McMaster signed into law Act 213, which directed districts to begin implementation of MTSS during the 2019–20 school year. Act 213 requires all districts and charter schools to annually report data on implementing MTSS and literacy universal screening procedures. **These district reports are due to the SCDE by June 28, 2024.**

The reporting requirement consists of two components:

1. A Formstack survey for district-level data; and
2. A single PowerSchool field for student-level data.

Before completing the survey, please review this year's [MTSS Data Reporting Guide](#), which comprehensively overviews the required data.

The Formstack survey includes district-level questions about the universal screening tool(s) used and overall results, district MTSS process, and professional development (PD) information. [The Formstack survey may be found here.](#)

Act 213 also recommends that districts develop procedures for optional screening to identify students at risk for numeracy and behavioral challenges. These screenings are not required for the 2024-25 school year. If your district would like assistance developing a screening process, please email Charlene Gleaton at cgleaton@ed.sc.gov.

The Universal Screening PowerSchool field may be found on the SC Student Information Page and should be completed for all kindergarten and first-grade students.
