


2010 RESULTS OF THE ADVANCED PLACEMENT* (AP*) EXAMINATIONS AND THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) EXAMINATIONS

Advanced Placement Results

Since 1984, each school district in South Carolina has been required to provide Advanced Placement (AP) courses in all secondary schools that include grade eleven or twelve. These classes prepare students for the national AP examinations. Students who score 3, 4, or 5 on an AP exam are, in many instances, considered qualified to receive credit for the equivalent course(s) at colleges and universities that give credit for AP exams. The data in this document are presented for high school students who participated in AP courses in the state's public schools and took at least one AP exam during the 2009–2010 school year.





The percentage of examinations with scores of 3 or higher for South Carolina public school students in 2010 was 55 percent (15,802 out of 28,763). For the nation, during the same period, the percentage of examinations with scores of 3 or higher for public school students was 56 percent. The number of exams taken in South Carolina public schools rose from 26,453 in 2009 to 28,763 in 2010, an increase of 8.7 percent, and the number of test-takers rose from 16,379 in 2009 to 17,766 in 2010, an increase of 8.5 percent.

Data used to compile this report were provided by the College Board in October 2010. This report does not reflect any changes the College Board may have made after October 2010.

The following chart provides information on the number of AP exams taken, the number of exams with scores of 3 to 5, and the number of public school students taking exams in South Carolina public schools during the past three years.



In 2010, 17,766 South Carolina public school students took 28,763 exams in 32 of 37 AP exam areas (students could take more than one test). The six most-taken AP exams were, in order, United States History, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Calculus AB, U.S. Government and Politics, and Statistics. Least-taken exams included Chinese, Latin Vergil, Comparative Government and Politics, and Spanish Literature.

In 2010, 52 percent of the 16,626 exams taken by 10,363 female public school students in South Carolina received scores of 3 to 5; 59 percent of the 12,137 exams taken by 7,403 male public school students received scores of 3 to 5; 28 percent of exams taken by 2,563 African American public school students received scores of 3 to 5; and 59 percent of exams taken by 12,734 white public school students received scores of 3 to 5.

The following table provides information in alphabetical order on the AP exams that were taken by South Carolina public school students in 2010, the numbers of 3 to 5 scores, and the percentages of 3 to 5 scores. The SC Department of Education does not provide performance data (--) for subgroups smaller than five in the scores category.
