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Priority School Criteria for Selecting Eligible Elementary and Middle School Students to Receive SES

- All students who attend a Title I identified Priority School are eligible to receive SES

Focus School Criteria for Selecting Eligible Elementary and Middle School Students to Receive SES

Students who qualify for SES include any student who scores resulted in:

- The “Not Met” category on PASS in the content areas of ELA, Math Science or Social Studies; **and or**
- Being a member of any sub-group in which the gap in achievement exists.

Focus School Criteria for Selecting Eligible High School Students to Receive SES

Students who qualify for SES include any student who scores resulted in:

- Not Passing the End-of-Course Examination in the English, Math or Science Courses Tested
- The Achievement Level 1 category for HSAP in English or math (Student has not demonstrated competence in the skills and knowledge required of high school students and has not met the exit examination requirement for a South Carolina high school diploma.);
- Being a member of any sub-group in which the gap in achievement exists; and
- Being a member of any sub-group in which the gap in Graduation Rate exists.

Districts may offer SES to students in non-tested grades or other identified subgroups once all of the required student selection/participation criteria have been met and contingent upon the availability of funding.

NOTE:

- Eligibility is not a guarantee that all students will be served.
- The number of students identified to be served is contingent upon the district’s total per pupil allocation for SES.
- In prioritizing students to be served, districts may want to consider the subject areas of ELA and math first.
