Title **My Interests (ELA-1)**
Subject **English/Language Arts** **Grade Level(s)** **3**

Career Development Objectives

1. The student will give a brief oral presentation.
2. The student will identify at least one interest, hobby, or something he/she likes to do.
3. The student will recognize that interests are related to future occupational choices.

Assessment

1. The student will give a brief oral presentation in which he/she describes an interest, a hobby, or something he/she likes to do.
2. The student will complete a collage about an interest, hobby, or something he/she likes to do.
3. Students will recognize that interests are related to future occupational choices (participation in class discussion and observation).

Preparation

- Prior Learning—None
- Handouts/Worksheets—N/A
- Resources/Materials—Magazines, crayons, construction paper, paste, scissors, and teacher's collage (optional)
- Time Required—45-90 minutes

Procedures

Part One—(45-90 minutes)

- In this activity, students create a collage and give a brief oral presentation in which they describe an interest, a hobby, or something they like to do.
- Open discussion by asking students to describe the hobbies, interests, or activities they enjoy.
- Explain to students how to create a collage that shows their interests, the things they like, etc. and provide the supplies for making the collage. (Optional: Show students a collage you have made as an example.)
- Give students time to complete their collages.
- After students have completed their collages, have them describe their collage to the class.

Part Two—Career Development Connections

- Introduce the concept that many people work in jobs that relate to their interests. Ask students to think of some examples (e.g., vet—likes animals, auto mechanic—likes cars, sales clerk—likes clothes).
- Ask students to brainstorm some jobs they might like to do that relate to their interests.
