2014 EBS Student Awards

The SCDE Office of Career and Technology Education and the Regional Career Specialists across the state annually recognize students who display a unique model of leadership. We are calling on you to nominate individuals for each student award listed below and submit to your Regional Career Specialist. Awards will be announced at the 2014 Education and Business Summit in June.

The SC Work-Based Learning Student of the Year Award is given to a student who applies academia to real life, real work, and real world situations within the business/industry environment. This student represents the skills needed through hands-on opportunities within the business/industry sector to meet the demands of our global economy. The student who wins this award defines career ready characteristics, showing evidence of the work-based learning influence on his or her career goal and future aspirations.

I AM CATE Given to a student who has graduated as a CATE completer and has made significant contributions as a student or worker in a field of study or career related to CATE(presented to four students, one from each major region in South Carolina).

CATE Service Learning Award Given to a CATE student, Career and Technical Student Organization, or CATE program for service-learning contributions to the community over the past school year.

Technology Champions South Carolina's Regional Career Specialists and the South Carolina Department of Education identify the top career and technology education student in each of the 12 Regional Career Specialists' service areas. These award-winning youth, designated as "Technology Champions," will be honored as South Carolina's most exemplary career and technology education students.

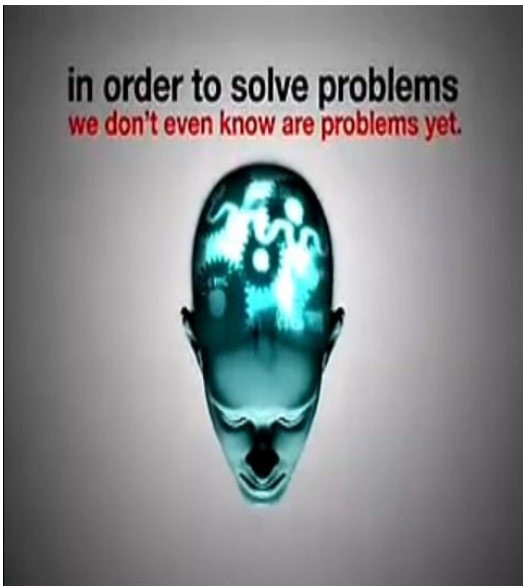

“We are currently preparing students for jobs that don’t exist yet. . .

In order to give our children a competitive advantage in this Information Age and global economy, we must teach them how to learn strategically -- to organize themselves, process new information efficiently, make critical decisions about that information and access it at a later time.

These types of learning skills are called "soft skills." They include learning, organization, and communication strategies. One study done by the Stanford Research Institute and Carnegie Melon Foundation found that **75 percent of long-term career success** depends on soft skills and only 25 percent on technical knowledge!

Another survey asked hundreds of employers in growing industries what skills they needed from their employees now, and in the future. Of the top 57 skills they listed, only four were related to technology. **Ninety-five percent** of the skills they need include things like: the ability to think critically, know how to use various learning strategies and manage time efficiently. "Soft skills" equal "study skills." Study skills allow students to use strategies in school.

Study skills are the skills:

- * Required to be an independent learner.
- * That build confidence.
- * That develop efficiency.
- * That allow students to be proactive, make good decisions, and think critically.
- * That improve performance to prepare students for high-stakes tests and the globally competitive job market of the future.

Study skills give students a competitive advantage for the future, help them earn better grades , and develop confidence!
