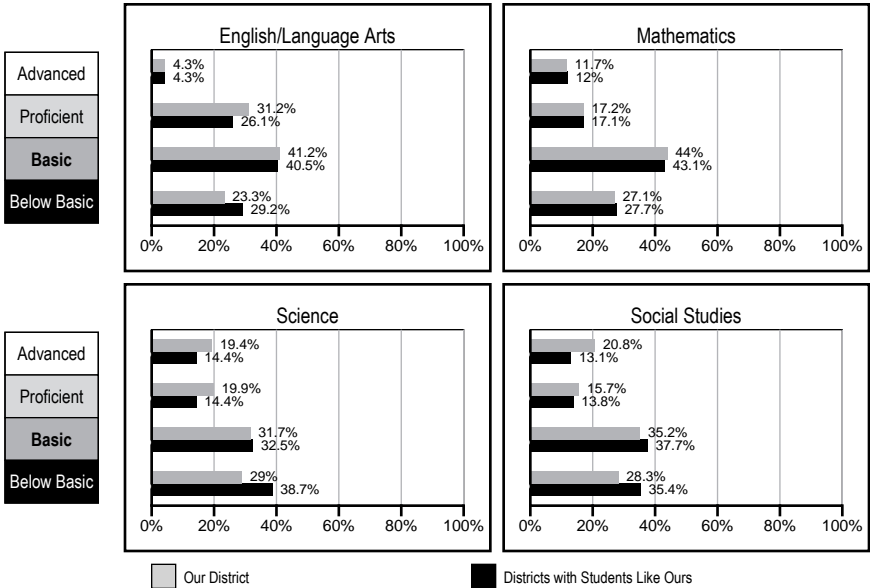

Anderson School District Three is proud of the continuing accomplishments of its students and staff. These achievements are the direct result of the dedication of the staff, the hard work of the students, and the support of parents and community.

Crescent High School's FFA chapter received the Gold Chapter Award. Crescent High School's softball team won its 22nd consecutive region championship and finished as 2A state runner-up. Students of the 2008 senior class received \$1.9 million in scholarships and four graduates qualified for the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship. A student at Starr Elementary School won first place in a Clemson University Martin Luther King Celebration 2008 poster contest. Several students from Starr-Iva Middle School participated in the National History Day competition in Washington, DC. Iva Elementary School was recognized by the Education Oversight Committee for closing the achievement gap through the 2007 PACT performance of historically underachieving students. Crescent High School and Iva Elementary School met Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) as defined by the United States Department of Education for the 2006-2007 school year.

A new school for Anderson School District Three, Flat Rock Elementary, opened in August for the 2008-2009 school year.

Currently all of the schools in Anderson School District Three are fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
