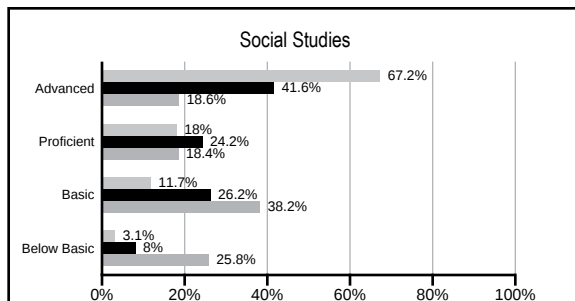

PACT PERFORMANCE

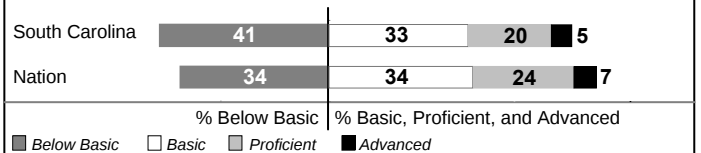
Our School Elementary Schools with Students Like Ours Elementary schools statewide



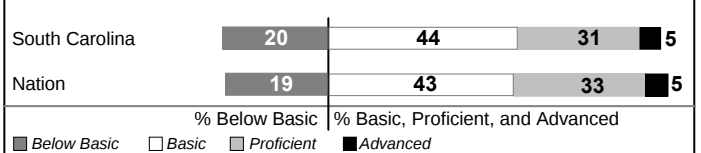

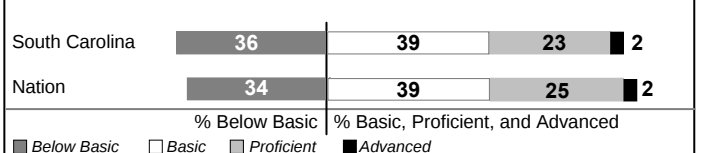
READING – GRADE 4 (2007)
