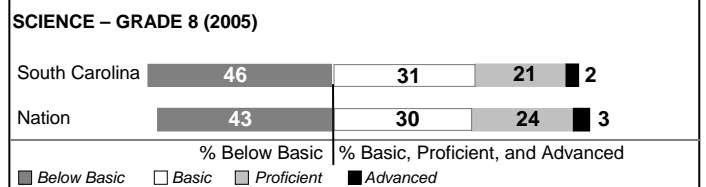
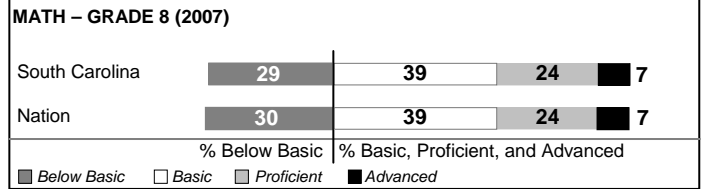
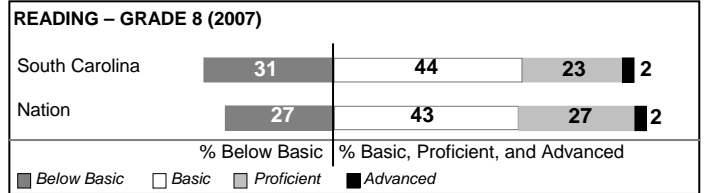

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Wagener-Salley High School once again experienced a positive school year in 2007–2008 because faculty and staff members, students, parents, and community members worked collaboratively to be successful.

Test scores rose in several areas. The ELA and mathematics portion of the High School Assessment Program saw an increase. Physical Science and Algebra I/Math Tech II End of Course Tests also improved. Programs were instituted to assist students taking the SAT and Advanced Placement courses. All seniors eligible to graduate successfully passed the HSAP.

Our ROTC program experienced great success in their third year, with thirty percent of the student population enrolled in the program at the start of the school year. The War Eagle Battalion received Honor Unit with Distinction during their formal inspection. The drill team also garnered first place honors at the Greeleyville JROTC competition.

The FFA once again brought home regional and state honors while being recognized as one of the top FFA programs in the state. The FFA won state in Tractor Driving and Tool ID competitions. The Drama club continued to grow and participated in the Garcia Project at USC-Aiken where they garnered first place honors as well as all of the cast members were named All-Star Cast.

The Vocational/Technical Department produced completers in all areas and was opened to students from another high school in our attendance area.

The School Improvement Council met during the school year and provided input regarding strategic planning and parental involvement.
