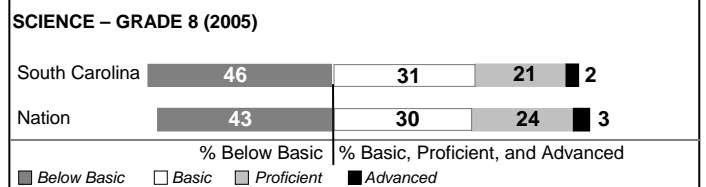
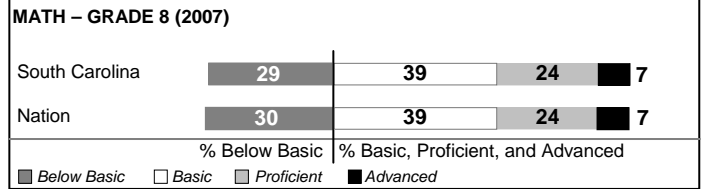
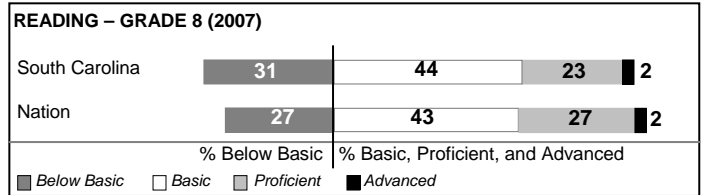

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Hillcrest High School has been a source of pride for the Simpsonville-Fountain Inn community for almost six decades. Hillcrest High is proud of the accomplishments of its students and of the programs offered here. The agricultural program is one of the largest and most diverse programs in the state. The business department is viewed as a model for other schools throughout South Carolina as well as being the largest in Greenville County. The average SAT scores at Hillcrest continue to improve each year.

We continue to make an impact upon our ninth graders with our Freshman Academy program. With common planning times, we have been able to increase collaboration among faculty members. We have also been able to provide an after school tutoring program for all of our students.

Hillcrest High School has been very fortunate to have access to various forms of technology for students and teachers. Our teachers continue to seek means to improve their instruction through additional professional development and certifications. Eleven teachers have received their National Board Certification and many others are pursuing this certification.

A variety of opportunities are available for student involvement at Hillcrest. We field a complete selection of sports teams, which proudly boast of regional and state championships. The agricultural department transformed the outdoor courtyards and was featured in the state Agricultural Science Magazine. Additionally, the students under the supervision of teachers planned and constructed the Hillcrest Greenhouse Industries. The Greenhouse opened its doors for business during the winter months, selling Christmas Trees and Wreaths, and again in the spring, selling flowers and vegetable plants.

Hillcrest continues to seek avenues in which students can exercise goodwill and leadership. This year, the student body, staff, and community raised over \$125,000 in one week in support of charitable organizations. We also hosted the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life and sponsored several fundraisers throughout the year for March of Dimes.

The local community strongly supports Hillcrest High School. Both athletic and academic booster clubs are strong and actively involved in providing support in the form of time and money for our students. Hillcrest is dedicated to providing a safe, positive learning environment, which brings together the resources of the staff, family, and community to create the best future possible for our students.
