REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

During the 2007-2008 school year, Loris High School students showed academic achievement and participated in a variety of extracurricular activities. Scholarships totaling more than two million dollars were earned by the class of 2008. Students were recognized at the state and national levels. Community-service-learning projects, extended-day learning activities, and summer enrichment programs were completed by students. We also repeated as the 2007-2008 Class AA South Carolina State Wrestling Champions.

In 2008, Loris High School received numerous academic recognitions. We were recognized by U.S. News and World Report in their inaugural edition of "America's Best High Schools." Loris High School was one of only eight high schools in South Carolina to receive this award.

Measurements of Academic Progress (MAP) allowed teachers to measure and monitor students' academic progress throughout the school year. Teachers and administration held conferences with specific students during the year, attempting to keep them focused on progress. In preparation for the South Carolina High School Assessment Program (HSAP) and end-of-course tests, ninth and tenth grade students were assigned additional math and English classes. Teachers from all curriculums introduced and reinforced lessons aimed at improving students' understanding of curriculum standards. After-school tutorial and computer lab programs were available for student use. Staff development sessions provided teachers and administrators with strategies to improve the teaching of reading and math across the curriculum, as well as strategies for working with at-risk students.

Instructional strategies implemented have had a positive effect on students' academic performance. The percent of ninth grade students promoted to tenth grade increased and the number of courses students failed declined. Our commitment to work with students, parents, and community members to ensure the academic success of all students is ongoing.
