REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Dorman High School and Dorman Freshman Campus served over 3,200 students during the 2007-2008 school year. We are extremely proud of the many outstanding accomplishments made by the Cavaliers this past school year. Some of the accomplishments are as follows:

 \$15,042,983 in scholarships awarded collectively to the Class of 2008;
 3 students qualified for the International Science and Engineering Fair in Atlanta;
 Academic team 3rd place finish in the Panasonic Academic Challenge Tournament;
 54 SCHSL Scholar Athletes, 36 All State Athletes, 78 All Region Athletes;
 Boys Track set state records in the 100 Meter Dash and 400 Meter Relay;
 State Championships in Competitive Cheer and Boys Track;
 State Runners Up in Girls Golf, Boys Cross Country, Girls Basketball;
