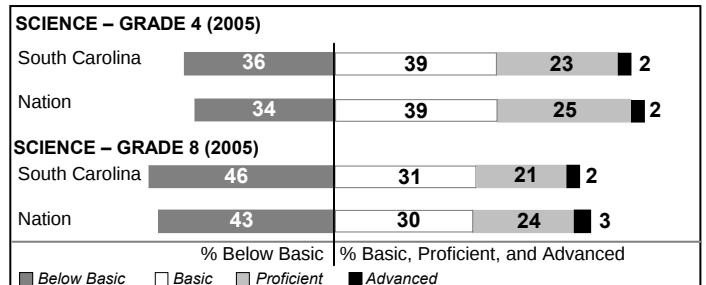
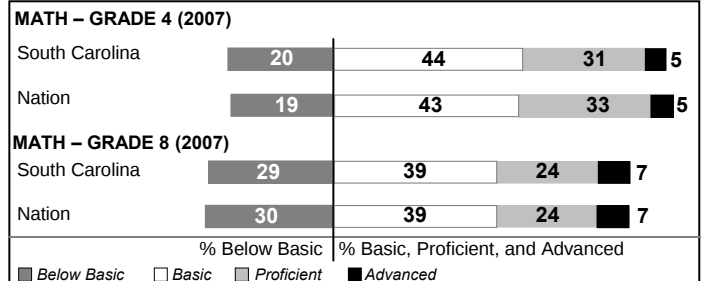
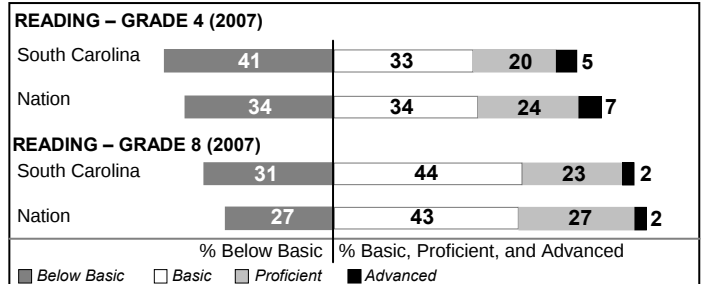

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of Marshall Primary School is to build a solid foundation for future learning by providing quality instruction. Marshall Primary has a strong faculty and staff and an extremely active PTO. Parent volunteers logged over 2,000 hours of service during the 2007-2008 school year. The Marshall Primary PTO raised funds to sponsor the crossing guard each morning and afternoon, folding chairs and carts, landscaping around the marquee, and a poster maker for faculty use. Marshall Primary has an involved School Improvement Council and Title One Committee that meets regularly to discuss and set future goals. We are a school with high academic achievement and strong ties to the community.

Marshall Primary School has had many accomplishments including: students in grades one and two participated in the District's Achievement Test; three hundred fifty students participated in the Young Author's Program; recipient of the State Farm Service Learning Award for the Loggerhead Sea Turtle project; students earned 32,761 points in the Accelerated Reading program; media center circulation was 21,527 books; Marshall Primary School hosted a 21st Century Community Learning Center; students in first and second grade participated in Math Masters, which reinforced and challenged new learning. Participating students scoring in the top percentage were rewarded with great opportunities such as a hot air balloon ride; Wee Deliver, a school-wide mail system, encouraged appropriate writing habits; two computer labs were maintained and utilized by all of our students; students served as news anchors during our closed-circuit morning news program; preschool and kindergarten classrooms reflected the standards on the Early Childhood Rating Scale; Wendy's Wonderful Kids and Positive Behavior Intervention Supports programs continued to promote character education; continued support from our business partners; parental involvement was emphasized through activities such as parent workshops, a fall festival, field day, Goodies with Grandparents, Pastries with Parents, Spring Arts Showcase, and Math/Technology Night, and plays and concerts; students collected canned goods for disadvantaged families; local veterans were honored on Memorial Day; Birthday Buddies provided each student an opportunity to celebrate their birthday with either a friend or family member, with a guest speaker presenting topics on positive character traits; and Teddy Bear Helpers gave new students a tour of the school and were special buddies during those first few days of getting acclimated to a new environment.

Beth Moore was our Teacher of the Year. Our Teacher of the Year for 2008-2009 will be Sandra Crowe. The school's theme for the 2008-2009 school year holds true as students continue to "PAWS for Learning."
